Course Content: Masters level course examining what money is and what money does. Money and banking are closely linked but are conceptually separate; most economies have both, and problems in banking have triggered several recent crises. Finance theory brings a different and useful perspective, and this course uses these approaches to shed some light on recent events.	Course Type: Lecture
Recommended Prerequisites: A macro-economics course at the Master's level or advanced course at the B.A. level. A course in finance theory (asset pricing models and pricing risk) would be useful, but not essential if the student puts in extra effort.
