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Göttingen Graduate School of Social Sciences after 5 years

How satisfied are you with the GGG?

What improvements would you like to see?

Since 2008, the GGG has introduced measures at various levels in a bid to improve conditions for PhD-students and further enhance the structured doctoral program. This wealth of experience gained over 5 years is now to be evaluated in 2013 in order to continue successful projects and facilitate improvements.

Over the past few years, an extensive (but far from complete) portfolio of training, support and funding measures has been compiled for Social Sciences PhDcandidates. The individual measures are continually evaluated to ensure that the wide range of PhD-students are catered for and the funding objectives are implemented. In doing so, feedback from PhDcandidates and supervisors, obtained after completion of the measures through discussions, reports and evaluation surveys, is of great importance. Their comments are taken into account for all further planning stages. Prominent examples of this collective involvement are provided in the arrangement of workshops at the annual Methodological Week, the provision of individual courses for PhD law students, and the improvement of bilingualism; all of which have already been implemented on the initiative of PhD-students and professors alike.

Over the last five years, the GGG has been able to offer a consistent range of programs to PhD-students in various forms. Therefore, we believe that now is a good time to hear about your experiences more systematically. We hope to collect your



opinions, praise, criticism and suggestions for improvement and take these into consideration for our future development.

In the form of a questionnaire, PhD-students, supervisors and partners in the university's administration departments are asked to evaluate their experiences including the support and funding measures provided by the GGG. All areas are covered by the questionnaire – from the establishment of the GGG in faculties and programs to the quality and attractiveness of programs offered; integration into initiatives which aim to support young talents and promote equality, as well as the question of the interdisciplinary added value of networking within the framework of GGG.

All GGG's areas of responsibility are analyzed, such as:

- support for PhD-students in times of crisis or in financial matters
- qualification opportunities
- funding measures (e.g. the GGG family grant, conference funding and travel grants)

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- the interdisciplinary network of PhDstudents, as well as
- the establishment and follow-up of new doctoral programs.

In this way, we would like to get a better impression of how visible to PhD-students the GGG really is by now; whether the measures are targeted and what can be improved.

The evaluation of questionnaires is complemented by discussions with PhDstudents and (other) experts, as well as data collection, which provide information about the use and results of GGG measures.

This evaluation is carried out by a monitoring group, which consists of a PhD- representative, board spokesperson, academic deans and employees. All this is critically evaluated by an external group of experts from the DFG [German Research Foundation], graduate schools from other universities and PhD-representatives, who "as outsiders looking in," provide feedback on strengths and weaknesses identified in GGG's progress to date, helping to avoid "blind spots" when considering suggestions for improvement.

Although the GGG evaluates its measures on an ongoing basis throughout the year, the upcoming, comprehensive evaluation enables quality standards, gaps and any potential for improvement for the Social Sciences PhD-program to be reconsidered more effectively and extensive measures to be taken. The evaluation results are then made available to the public, making them fully transparent, in order to facilitate a university-wide process of further developing support for PhD-students as well as good scientific practice.

Feedback from PhD-students and supervisors is directly taken into account for further planning stages, i.e. when modifying GGG and faculty collaboration and designing measures with and for PhD-students.

We would therefore now like to make you aware of this evaluation phase and invite you to participate actively by providing feedback and suggestions for improvement. Please feel free to get in touch with the Executive Board or GGG office at any time (see last page).

We are looking forward to this opportunity to capitalize on our existing wealth of experience and learn how we can continually improve.
