Academic Career-Development

Starting a Career after receiving a PhD

PhD-students are not a homogenous group of future professors, but rather they are usually trying to get into a variety of professions within as well as outside the university. Our aim is to support them in pursuing their goals.

After receiving their doctoral degree students have a lot of career opportunities within and outside the university. Professorships as well as positions in science management, enterprises, administration, and other organizations are just some of the areas where academics can find an occupation. The challenge here is to find a field of occupation that fits the individual profile and ensures the best conditions for the full development of talent and knowledge.

Writing a PhD-thesis is a great opportunity for students to practice their abilities to focus on one topic for a longer period of time and to systematically analyze a problem in order to develop strategies to solve it. These are the skills companies are looking for when they want to fill positions that require complex creative skills such as in team management. Growing numbers of employees at some companies require an additional mid-management level in order to optimize the workflow. Those positions can be very interesting especially for PhD-students. Already while writing a doctoral thesis, the corporation with enterprises

can give students an insight look on the latest practical research methods. And after receiving their PhD-degree students can use these experiences when working for these companies.

Science and practice should not be seen as mutually exclusive. Rather the process of earning a PhD-degree should include scientific as well as practical experiences, so that with the beginning of their professional careers students can rely on a profound amount of practical experience. Modern science cannot work without a project management, likewise do modern enterprises and political institutions rely on academic knowledge. Despite formal barriers have the transitions between both areas become increasingly fluent.

These developments also have a growing impact on doctoral studies, even though the development of scientific competences in research and theory are still the main part of it. In addition though soft skills like cooperating, representing, and other practical competences have become increasingly important.

Paving the Way for your Career

Preparing young academics for a professional career should therefore work on different levels. For an academic career the GGG offers support and supervision within our doctoral training program. These programs also aim to integrate students coming from abroad and offer help, support, and PhD-agreements. Students looking for a career outside the university will find support within the network of the GGG and the SME-network of the GGG.



Qualifying for an Academic Career

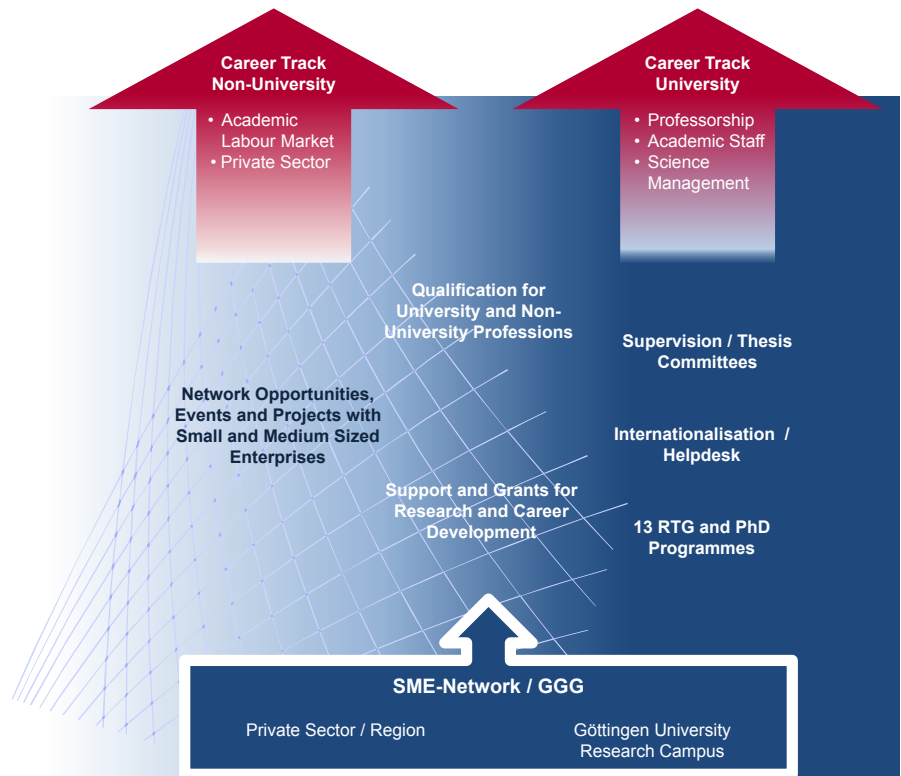
All our measurements and training programs support both career options by offering various forms of support (including financial funding) for research and international exchange as well as practical projects. As a result qualifications of PhD-students have become much more diverse. Today the University of Göttingen supports the development of scientific skills like scientific communication and academic didactics as well as practical competences such as career development, leadership skills, time management, and presentation techniques. In addition PhD-students can learn how to organize and participate in international meetings. Against the backdrop of a changing approach towards the general idea of an academic career, becoming a professor now is not the only ultimate goal anymore. Rather professional careers, entrepreneurship, science management, and careers in administration have become more and more attractive. Courses and trainings that look to prepare students for these career types have also become increasingly popular and constantly gain positive feedback.

Together with the Graduate School for Social Sciences (GSGG), the Dorothea-Schlö-

zer-Program, the Equal Opportunities Office, and other mentoring programs the GGG presents its Qualification Portal for PhD-students online at (www.qualiportal-promovierende.uni-goettingen.de) as well as in our annual booklet. By doing so we want to give students easier access to our

offers and by the same time improve the organization of our courses and the courses offered by our partners. With all these measures we want to support students of social sciences to prepare them for their professional careers as soon as possible.



Do you know...?

Since November 2011 **Jan H. Höffler** and **Anna-Christin Ransiek** are the new PhD-representatives at the GGG.

Jan H. Höffler works as research associate at the Chair of Statistics and Econometrics. Within the scope of a competition for research oriented learning and teaching he gives students an understanding of his research topic: the replication of empirical studies.

Anna-Christin Ransiek is a PhD-student in Sociology. She teaches at the Center of Methods in Social Sciences where she is also involved in the consultation for students on qualitative methods.

Jan H. Höffler and Anna-Christin Ransiek already improved the integration of foreign students with their initiative to provide more information in English.

They also pursue to establish PhD-representatives at each faculty, each research training group and each PhD-program of the GGG. This shall help PhD-students to represent their interests and to better share their experience in the various subunits of GGG. Moreover they intend to improve the networking of PhD-students by creating an interdisciplinary PhD-forum. By continuing the questionnaire which was established by the former PhD-representatives to evaluate the need of PhD-students they also intend to provide a basis for the evaluation of supervision.

Business and Science

Looking Into Science

With the release of this issue of the GGG's newsletter we will start a new series named "Looking into Science". In this section we will inform you about new developments and studies on which research-teams of the university's social sciences are currently working on. This way you will be provided with valuable information about the practical and economic values of these studies as soon as possible. Therefor summaries of the

latest dissertations will be presented including evaluations of their economic impact and meaning. Hereby we want to give enterprises the chance to benefit from the latest studies and to use these results in a practical way. But we also want to create and encourage personal contacts between members of the university and the economy.

Educational Returns in Germany

Companies looking to survive the current lack of skilled specialists have to find ways to train their own employees, to prepare them for future tasks. Hereby the financial benefits of further education are of major importance, this already applies for school-leaving qualifications.

Results Overview

A recent doctoral thesis by Anja Gelzer shows that education results in higher salaries, this already includes the type of high school diploma. Ms Gelzer is member of the Faculty of Economics at the University of Göttingen and wrote her thesis under the supervision of Prof. Bizer. The study shows that a higher level of school-leaving diploma results in a significantly higher financial return compared to vocational training. In the past the reduction of returns has been greater for "Hauptschule"-graduates compared to the returns of "Realschule"-graduates or students who received their "Abitur". Students who undergo a vocational training to start a career as skilled manual workers have to expect lower income returns compared to students with higher qualifications. While additional vocational training usually does not result in higher payments, an additional academic degree significantly increases financial benefits.

Relevancy for SME

Decisions regarding education are rarely based just on individual choices. Companies should continuously overthink the costs and outcomes of investments in education. A lot of companies though react too hesitantly regarding investments in additional training. Seen from an economic standpoint and looking at a globalized market, specialized and qualified employees guarantee innovations and success. At the same time ongoing vocational training and additional qualification measures are becoming more important as part of human resources policies. On the one hand the need for skilled workers has to be covered which becomes more and more important

regarding the demographic changes. On the other hand studies like the one mentioned above can help to convince employees and show them how they can benefit from getting better degrees and additional training.

Both employers and employees should benefit from such measurements. The individual educational return can also be described as private interest rate and companies usually reward additional degrees with higher salaries. Experience shows that SMEs very often are not able to compete with the wage level of bigger enterprises. Here the concept of educational returns fails to show how skilled and specialized workers can be attracted offering them other incentives such as job security, flexible working hours, home office programs, a better work environment, and more responsibility.
