Most of the final exams will take place during the three weeks following the lecture period (some courses may offer exams already during the lecture period in order to meet the international academic calendar).

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Semester dates

What types of courses are offered?

Students can choose between:

- 1) lectures (sometimes complemented with a tutorial/practice session)
- 2) seminars.

Lectures involve that students have to attend the course on a weekly basis, either 1.5 or 3 hours per week and take a (mostly written) exam at the end of the semester.

A seminar does mostly not involve presence teaching but a preparatory meeting at the beginning of the semester where each student is assigned to a topic to write a paper on (10-15 pages) independently under the teacher's supervision. At the end of the seminar all papers are presented and discussed and participants are graded based upon their paper, presentation, and participation in the seminar (discussion of other participants' papers).

Course structure, enrolment, and registration

Do you offer language courses?

Yes, we offer a variety of language courses. Do students have to be pre-enrolled or pre-registered?

For lectures there is no registration required. However, if students wish to participate in seminars, a registration is often necessary. So please check the course descriptions before you arrive in Göttingen.

Almost all our courses (lecture or seminar) passed are awarded with 6 ECTS. We recommend all our regularly enrolled and exchange students to choose courses of a workload of 30 ECTS each semester, meaning that usually students take five courses per semester. The chosen courses have to be listed in a Learning Agreement that is signed by the Coordinator of the Study Abroad Advisory Services.

We will try to guide our exchange students through the process of finding the right courses. Please come to see the coordinator during the first weeks in Göttingen.

We offer at least 30-60 courses in English in any given semester, the schedule is usually set up about three-four months in advance and constantly updated up until a few days before the semester starts (opportunities to include guest lecturers often occur spontaneously).
