Language(s) of instruction	General language of instruction: German / English Approx. 60 courses taught in English are offered at the Faculty per semester
Language(s) requirements	At least fluent in English (level B2), some German is beneficial
Application deadline	Winter semester (Oct-Jan): June 1 st

	<p><u>Documents required for application:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Official transcript of records - Application form from http://www.uni-goettingen.de/en/48917.html - Proof of valid health insurance (European Health Insurance Card) for students from non-EU countries. -> This document will be required during enrollment. <p><u>Important Note:</u> With enrollment, student's organization fees and the semester ticket fee of ca. 260. - Euro are due for one semester. You will receive a remittance slip for the bank during the introductory event. <p>Course structure, enrolment, and registration</p>  	<p><u>What kinds of courses are offered?</u> Students can choose between:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) lectures (sometimes complemented with a tutorial/practice session) 2) seminars. <p>Lectures involve that students have to attend the course on a weekly basis, either 1.5 or 3 hours per week and take a (mostly written) exam at the end of the semester.</p> <p>A seminar does mostly not involve presence teaching but a preparatory meeting at the beginning of the semester where each student is assigned to a topic to write a paper on (10-15 pages) independently under the teacher's supervision. At the end of the seminar all papers are presented and discussed and participants are graded based upon their paper, presentation, and participation in the seminar (discussion of other participants' papers).</p> <p><u>Do you offer language courses?</u> Yes, we offer a variety of language courses. Exchange students can participate in an intensive German course prior to lectures start (fee-based) https://www.iik-goettingen.de/en/courses/preparatory-german-courses/upcoming-german-courses/ as well as attend various classes during the semester (free-of-charge): http://www.uni-goettingen.de/en/7710.html</p> <p><u>Do students have to be pre-enrolled or pre-registered?</u> For lectures there is no registration required. However, if students wish to participate in seminars, a registration is often necessary. So please check the course descriptions before you arrive in Göttingen.</p> <p><u>Learning Agreement:</u> Every course (lecture or seminar) passed is awarded with 6 Credit Points (ECTS). We recommend all our regularly enrolled and exchange students to choose courses of a workload of 30 ECTS each semester, meaning that</p>

	<p>usually students take five courses per semester. The chosen courses have to be listed in a Learning Agreement (http://www.uni-goettingen.de/en/international-students/427866.html) that is signed by the Coordinator of the Study Abroad Advisory Services.</p> <p>We will try to guide our exchange students through the process of finding the right courses. Please come to see the coordinator during the first weeks in Göttingen.</p>
<p>In what specific areas do you offer courses to exchange students?</p> 	<p>We offer at least 30-60 courses in English in any given semester, the schedule is usually set up about three-four months in advance and constantly updated up until a few days before the semester starts (opportunities to include guest lecturers often occur spontaneously).</p> <p>For an overview of our courses held in English please visit: http://www.uni-goettingen.de/en/33399.html</p> <p>We have a wide range of courses in the field of economics and business administration, econometrics, agricultural sciences and rural development. Our economic courses focus on economic theory and policy and our forte is development economics, focusing on micro- and macro issues of development, institutions, and quantitative methods.</p> <p>Overview of all courses (Bachelor and Master programmes): http://www.uni-goettingen.de/en/422962.html</p> <p>Are there any restrictions?</p> <p>We recommend our exchange students to attend courses according to their academic level (Bachelor students should participate in Bachelor courses).</p>
