Election of the new PhD representatives starts now!

The PhD representatives speak up for the needs and ideas of the PhD-students and thus contribute to the work of the graduate school as well as to the development of the university. Now, the candidates present themselves, so that you can make a good choice during the election period between the 18th of November and 4th of December 2013.

The PhD spokesperson of the GGG represents the interests of the PhD-students in the field of social sciences within and beyond Göttingen University. The spokesperson has a full right to vote in the management board of the GGG and is involved in the central planning and organization processes for the GGG activities. He/She is the contact person for the very heterogeneous group of PhD-students and can bring their concerns and wishes to the attention of the faculty and the general public. The PhD representation consists of a spokesperson and his/her deputy and is annually elected by the PhD-students.

Examples of recent improvements achieved by the PhD representatives include the better funding opportunities for PhD-students, the improved advisory services of the GGG, the comprehensive English translation of all general information as well as the GGG website, the establishment of PhD representatives in the faculties and the very close cooperation between the respective PhD representatives and the GGG-team.

Above all, I'm looking at how their careers have been set up – by chance or on purpose – and how recruitment decisions in science are (really) being taken and reasons why there are still so few women in top positions in science. I studied Political Science with a focus on the EU, Sociology and Newer English Literature at the University of Tübingen and passed a nice study year in Pisa (Italy).

In my PhD I'm analyzing closely the structure of university as an organization and what influence this structure has on the career paths and possibilities in science. It is a fact that taking a career in science is a very strenuous and difficult path to take in Germany, today. I would like to represent

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the PhD-students to improve our situation at the GGG. I would like to find answers and better solutions i. e. to the following questions: How can the employment situation of research assistants be improved? Which kind of funding and financial support for PhD-students should be enlarged? How can the support of the 'thesis committee' be improved and simplified? How can we enhance the networking and scientific exchange of PhD-students working in the same field of study coming from different disciplines? Besides trying to find better solutions to these questions, I would like to enlarge the program of qualification measures for PhD-students, e. g. offer courses about employment rights (in science, research or other fields of work) in Germany and possibilities to research and work in other countries (e. g. other EU member states, the USA, Canada or countries in Asia).

About

I am an interdisciplinary working PhD candidate at the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences. In my project I focus on the topic of valuing nature in qualitative, quantitative and monetary ways.

Before my PhD I studied and worked at the University of Gothenburg, Sweden, with focus on human ecology. I did my B.A. in social sciences at the Leibniz-University in Hanover.

Due to my interdisciplinary work I would like to create more platforms for networking and discussion between the faculties, departments and groups. There is a lot to gain from collaborative research, especially for PhD-students. This networking could be on different levels including students,

PhD-students and post-docs. Interdisciplinary connections do not only increase the quality of research and publications but also strengthen the position of PhD-students as it leads out of isolation.

Also, I would like to strengthen the position of PhD-students and their rights in face of conflicts with or high dependency on supervisors. The work of the current PhD representatives should be kept going to create a sense of coherence for the staff and students. Additionally, the current financial situation for many PhD-students is precarious. Many students face at least once the problem of financial insecurity – be it in the first semester, the publication period or for the full course of their PhD. When elected, I would like to see if there are possibilities to improve this situation. This may be possible by widening the information on available grants and increasing the help with grant writing or likewise.

News of the GGG

Evaluation of the GGG

The evaluation of the measures and achievement of objectives of the GGG is running at full speed at the moment (please see newsletter 01|2013 for background information). The multifaceted results of the late summer online survey with PhD-students and supervisors about their satisfaction and wishes are currently analyzed and will be published at the beginning of 2014 (e.g. in the newsletter). Furthermore, the existing measures were discussed in an expert hearing on 7th November in which external experts as well as PhD-students, the university's president, the deans, the dean of studies, the management board and the employees of the GGG participated. Among other things, it became apparent that the GGG is very successful regarding its service orientation as well as its offered qualification programs and sponsorships. In addition, needs for improvement were revealed, e.g., regarding the integration of external PhD-students, the support of international PhD-students, professors, and the support of PhD supervisors. Besides, supporting the career progress of PhD-students – e.g. by establishing contacts between PhD-students and local enterprises via the SME-network of the GGG – also turned out to be an important field of work that should be developed further in the near future.

The discussion on the future tasks of the GGG and the co-operation between the GGG and the faculties will be continued during the next months, with the aim of further increasing our members' satisfaction with the GGG.

New mentoring schemes for PhD-students

The GGG supports PhD-students on their preparation for different university-internal or external career paths. In addition to

the existing course program, since 2013, the GGG in cooperation with the mentoring coordination office offers several mentoring schemes for a career in sciences, in scientific management and for the first steps in a private business environment (for detailed information please see newsletter 03|2013). The mentoring schemes are all created for one year. For next year, the schemes are advertised again.
