## 3 Slavic Language Courses

Our department offers a wide range of Slavic language courses: Bosnian-Croation-Serbian (BCS), Bulgarian, Czech, Polish, Russian, and Ukrainian. Polish and Russian can be learned up to level C2, remaining languages up to B1. Courses for beginners end in level A1 or A1+, take place in winter terms, and consist of the regular language course during the semester plus an intense language course in the semester break (October).
