The Global Rise of Religious Violence

Mark Juergensmeyer (University of California, Santa Barbara)



An illustrated lecture based on the speaker's case studies and interviews with religious activists around the world, including jihadi activists in Iraq and Palestine, Buddhist militants in Myanmar, Jewish extremists in Israel, and Christian militants in the US and Europe. It explores the role of religion in these violent movements and asks whether religion is the problem, or whether its role is simply problematic.

Mark Juergensmeyer is professor of sociology and global studies, affiliate professor of religious studies, and the Kundan Kaur Kapany professor of global and Sikh Studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara. He has written or edited over twenty books, including Global Rebellion: Religious Challenges to the Secular State (2008), and Terror in the Mind of God: The Global Rise of Religious Violence (2003).
