II. Applicants whose native language is not Persian must have sufficient knowledge of Persian. Sufficient knowledge of the language is proven by achievements in the field of Persian language to the extent of 18 C; instead of proof by credits, the required language skills can be proven by successful participation in the language practical aptitude test of the Georg-August University.

2. Compulsory modules

The compulsory area does not apply for students who have already acquired knowledge of Persian worth 36 C in the Bachelor program, or who have demonstrated a corresponding level in the practical language test, or whose native language is Persian.
