Who are we?

EnriCo is a research training group (RTG) funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) and based at Göttingen University in Germany. The aim of the project is to look at the effects the enrichment of European beech forests with conifers has on different ecosystem functions and processes. Thus, we are 12 PhD students from different parts of the world working in different subprojects to investigate various facets of the forest ecosystem, including biotic and abiotic processes as well as economic and statistical aspects.

What do we offer?

Within our projects, we are always looking for student helpers to assist us in field or lab work or help with data analysis. These positions are funded, and available only for students enrolled at the University of Göttingen. As an immediate perspective, you could come to Göttingen and enroll for short term studies, take courses in forestry or German and/or English classes, while working with us to finance your stay. In the long-term, you will have the possibility to apply for one of the university's regular study programs and continue your academic education.

Who can apply?

We wish to support Ukrainian Master/Bachelor students in the broad field of forestry whose lives and studies were disrupted by the recent invasion and ongoing war in the country. If you are considering leaving Ukraine or have already done so, wish to pursue your field of study and find a safe place to stay, we are glad to hear from you and welcome you in Göttingen. To be able to enroll at Göttingen University for one of the regular study programs in the long term, you will need to have passed eleven years of school and one year of university studies.
