

# Timetable creation in the Master of Arts

## for students in their FIRST semester

### What do I need to create a timetable?

To create a timetable, you will need four tools:

- Exemplary study plan
- Module directory
- HISinOne EXA
- Stud.IP

### How do I go about creating a timetable?

As a rule of thumb:

First plan the subject study or module package in which there is the smaller selection of courses. Then plan the subject study or the other module packages. In larger subjects, you have more choice in courses, because they are often offered at different times.

Examples of larger subjects:

- German Studies: German Philology
- English: Language, Literatures and Cultures/English
- History
- Philosophy

### Where can I find an exemplary study plan?

You can find an exemplary study plan for your subjects in the “Examination and Study Regulations” of the respective subject. You can find this document by clicking on your subject in the [A-Z list](#) under the item “Course of Studies”.

Please open the latest version. At the end of the document, you will find one or more exemplary study plans. These are suggestions as to the order in which the modules\* can be studied. In the next step, you have to find out which courses you have to take for a module. You can find this information in the module directory.

## Where can I find the module directory?

You will find the module directory that is currently valid for your as another document on the same page as the “Examination and Study Regulations”. In the module directory, you will find the information that counts for your variant of the Master’s degree program under “Overview according to module groups” (subject study program of 78 or 42C, module package of 36 or 18C). Click on the module in the PDF that you have selected in the exemplary study plan. This will take you to the module description.

This contains important information, including:

- Name of the module
- Number of credits
- Courses
- Examination (pre-)performance(s)
- Frequency and duration
- Admission requirements

## When and where do the courses take place?

From the module description you now know which courses belong to the module. The courses are listed in EXA. Log in via [eCampus](#) and select the course catalogue. Then click on “Faculty of Humanities” and then on your respective subject. Now look for the corresponding courses. Always check whether the course is actually assigned to the module you want to take.

You can usually find this information under the item “Examinations/Modules”. If necessary, please also read the remarks and the commentary carefully, as important information is often contained here, e.g. on the registration modalities.

## Where do I have to register?

As a rule, you have to register via Stud.IP. Please note the information on the respective registration modalities in EXA. You can also reach Stud.IP via [eCampus](#).

Often you can only register for courses during certain time slots. If you have questions about registration, please contact the respective lecturer or your subject.

Please note that registration in Stud.IP does not replace registration in FlexNow. If you want to take an exam, you must also register for it in FlexNow on time towards the end of the semester.
