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The Interdisciplinary Methodological Week

New concept as of 2014

The Interdisciplinary Methodological Week is an annual offer by the GGG, which now takes place for the ninth time. One aim of the methodological week is the communication and in-depth study of different methods from the field of social sciences and related disciplines. In addition, exchange and networking of PhD-students play an important role. In order to have ideal conditions for the communication of methods as well as for exchange, the methodological week always takes place in one block. This is also attractive for external PhD-students and facilitates participation considerably. The various methods are presented in the form of workshops; they are jointly developed and often tested on one's own PhD project as an example. The workshops change every year, with particularly established and high demand methods being offered on a regular basis. At the end of the methodological week, the workshops and lecturers as well as the organization and general framework of the methodological week are evaluated.

The innovations

From this year on, taking up the suggestions of the evaluations and of discussions with PhD-students, we have further adjusted the concept of the methodological week to the requirements, and optimized it. Up to now, the structure of the methodological week was designed in a way, that – in addition to a common welcome address – there were two blocks of workshops, each running over two days, as well as a public evening. Now, there will be a further increased focus on the workshops and the methods. Specifically, this means that from now on, there will

be only one workshop block running over the entire duration of the methodological week. This allows an in-depth discussion of the particular method and eliminates the need for changing into another workshop.

Furthermore, the methodological week will now start on the first day with a keynote speech on methodological questions, which allows all participants to have a common, interdisciplinary start. In addition, the evening event is omitted in favor of the keynote speech.

This new structure focusses even more on the different methods and thereby more strongly emphasizes the "summer school" aspect of the methodological week. This is underlined by the new date of the methodological week. Instead of being right before the lecture period in fall, it will now take place in summer, immediately after the end of lectures.

Awarding of credit points

Besides meeting the wish for having more time for content-related working in the workshops, the new format also matches the PhD-students' need for clearer rules concerning credit awarding.

While until now, one session in every workshop block had to be taken and the required performance in both blocks had to be accomplished, the need to take a second workshop, which might suit personal interests less, is eliminated. Credit points can now be obtained through complete participation in one workshop and producing the specific

performance required. Nevertheless, the workload in the new format remains the same and it still applies that no credits are awarded if absence exceeds 10% of the compulsory attendance time. The methodological week can of course also be attended without credit acquisition. Active participation is, however, required anyway. A purely passive participation is not possible.

Certificate of performance

PhD-students can obtain 3 ECTS points for their active participation in the entire methodological week. This comprises the keynote speech as well as active participation in the selected workshop including the required (written) performance in that workshop. With additional performances, 4 ECTS points are possible, too. An entirely passive participation is not possible. In addition, no credits can be awarded if absenteeism exceeds 10% of the compulsory attendance time.


The new GGG PhD representatives
