Module No.: M.WIWI-VWL.0010 Title: Development Economics III: Regional Perspectives on Economic Development	Credits: 6 C
Course Content: This course will focus on regional perspectives in economic development of the past decades. The regions considered will be South and East Asia, Sub Saharan Africa, and Latin America. Emphasis will be placed on a comparative approach and both macro as well as micro perspectives will play a role. It would be advantageous if students had taken Entwicklungsökonomie I or II prior to this course or enrolled in one of the two concurrently.	Course Type: Lecture

Recommended Prerequisites: Knowledge in Statistics, Wachstum und Entwicklung, Entwicklungsökonomie I or similar courses is desirable.	Exam: There will be a 1 ½ hour exam at the end of the course (50%). In addition, students are required to write a term paper of about 7-9 pages (50%).
Recommended Semester: 1-4 semester	Cycle: every winter term
