

Module overview and Structure 'Development Economics' for students in the double degree programme with the University of Stellenbosch¹

3. Master's thesis (Göttingen or Stellenbosch)

In general, the master's thesis is completed in the period from November to March, either at the University of Göttingen or at the University of Stellenbosch. 30 C are awarded for the successful completion of the master's thesis.

The Master's thesis must be written in English.

If the Master's thesis is completed at the University of Stellenbosch, the examination regulations of the University of Stellenbosch apply to admission, supervision and assessment.

If the Master's thesis is completed at the University of Göttingen, the examination regulations of the University of Göttingen apply. In these cases, the acquisition of 18 C from the compulsory area is a prerequisite for admission to the Master's thesis.

4. Specialisation course of study (Göttingen)

The specialist field of studies then takes place in the fourth semester at the University of Göttingen; modules with a total rating of 30 C must be completed successfully in accordance with the following provisions.
