



Student assistants wanted!

The Functional Agrobiodiversity is looking for **student assistants (m/f/d)** to **support field work** in the InterRest project in 2023.

InterRest explores the influence of restoration measures on interactions and ecosystem functions on calcareous grasslands. To investigate pollination services, we study the reproductive output of two focus plant species.

Tasks include supporting the conduction of a pollinator exclusion experiment and collecting and counting seeds on calcareous grasslands in the vicinity of Göttingen.

The recruitment is expected to take place from **August to October 2023** at approx. 40 hrs per month (or less), possibly with an option to extend. A driving license is required. Time flexibility is beneficial.
