Bachelor seminar: The causes and consequences of conflicts

Content:

Over 10,000 people die in armed conflicts each year. Nowadays, more than 50 conflicts are ongoing in the world¹. Its consequences go far beyond the direct death. Forced migration, hunger and epidemics but also missing education and job opportunities are potential outcomes of violent conflicts. Knowing where and when conflicts break out is important to design effective protection and counter mechanisms. In this seminar, we will have a look on several determinants of armed conflicts as well as its devastating consequences like the impact on human, social and physical capital. This is done by examining and evaluating current empirical economic studies. Thus, apart from the focus on conflicts, students will learn to read and analyze empirical studies.
