Title: International Trade	6C
Course Content:	Course Type:
This course introduces the students to the core theoretical concepts explaining international trade patterns and various sources of trade flows like different technologies and factor endowments. Furthermore, the students learn about the gains and losses from international trade and the effect on factor prices and wages. In addition to the traditional explanations for trade patterns, recent approaches are introduced which are able to explain patterns that are observed today. Moreover, we discuss whether the predictions implied by theoretical models can be confirmed empirically.	Lecture and exercise class
