NOTE! NEW DATE: Publication Strategies (not only) for Social Scientists on March 15, 2017

In cooperation with experts from Göttingen State and University Library (SUB) and co-editors from the journal "New Diversities" of the Max Planck Institute (MPI) for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity the GGG invites you to a workshop on publication possibilities in the Social Sciences.

You will be provided with information on aspects of "Open Science" as well as on offers by the SUB. Furthermore, review requirements of professional journals will be explained. Special focus lies on good scientific practice, especially on the proper way of archiving and publishing your research data. Although the workshop first and foremost addresses doctoral students of Social Sciences, the publication strategies explained will be helpful for other doctoral students as well.

This workshop is held alternately in English and German: The reviewer of the journal "New Diversities" will present in English while the information of SUB will be given in German. The Week of Methods, as an annual program encompassing all GGG member faculties, aims to encourage interdisciplinary discussions on methodology. The Week of Methods allows PhD students to avail themselves of methodological stimuli and solutions in related disciplines while developing their dissertation. They are empowered to select methodological approaches particularly suitable for their research question. This breaks the traditional methodological limits of disciplines, opens up new approaches and enables critical reflection for the PhD students. Higher Education Didactics workshops for all university teachers on February 24 and March 23, 2017

Göttingen University's Equal Opportunities Office (project "Integrating Gender into Teaching") organizes two workshops for all (newly appointed) university teachers in cooperation with the Division for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education: The workshop "Fairer lehren. Geschlechterreflektierende Didaktik an Hochschulen" (Fair Teaching: Gender-Conscious Didactics at Universities) will take place on February 24. The overall goal of gender-conscious didactics at universities is to create a learning-friendly environment and participation opportunities for every student. This workshop gives you the opportunity to get to know the content-based approach and didactic instruments and methods of gender-conscious didactics in practice. Of course, participants can contribute with their own teaching experience. Furthermore, on March 23, the workshop "Diversitätsgerechtes Prüfen und Bewerten" (Diversity-Conscious Examination and Evaluation) will take place. In everyday research and teaching at German universities, the students' diversity is increasingly important. With different backgrounds, students are sitting in their exams together, having the same goals but a divergent approach to the learning contents. This workshop will discuss the possibilities of heightened diversity awareness in teaching with special regard to reviewing teaching contents.
