The Rosa-Luxemburg-Stiftung Master Fellowship in Modern Indian Studies at the Centre for Modern Indian Studies, University of Göttingen

The [Rosa-Luxemburg-Stiftung](#) (RLS) and the [Center for Modern Indian Studies](#) (CeMIS) at the University of Göttingen invite applications for a jointly-sponsored fellowship to pursue a two-year MA program in Modern Indian Studies at CeMIS, beginning in **October 2022, for a period of two years.**

RLS follows in the radical legacy of its namesake, the German socialist leader Rosa Luxemburg, committed to fostering public awareness and social critique in the tradition of worker's movements and women's movements, and in struggles against fascism and racism. At CeMIS, students are equipped with the necessary methodological and conceptual tools to engage in such critique: the MA Fellow will join CeMIS and RLS in the production and dissemination of rigorous scholarship on the unequal and unjust social relations governing our globalized world.

Both RLS and CeMIS seek to address the highly unequal access to education facing students in India. This fellowship will therefore fund a student from a marginalized background who, in addition, has a demonstrated commitment to social change and activism.

To be eligible to apply, applicants MUST therefore meet ALL of the following criteria:

- Have a BA degree with proof of at least 150 completed credits (or equivalent) in one of the following fields of study:
 - (1) History
 - (2) Sociology/ Social Anthropology
 - (3) Political Science
 - (4) Economics
- Demonstrable engagement with social or political movements and social critique.
- English language certification at B2 level at the time of application (C1 is required for matriculation at Göttingen University but a successful applicant can pursue language training, funded by the fellowship, prior to arrival in Germany.)
- Applicants must be included in one or more of the following categories: (1) Dalit or Adivasi, (2) religious minority (3) children of informal sector labourers.

Applicants must provide the following materials:

- Official documentation of
 - (1) BA certificate
 - (2) Transcript of records with proof of at least 150 credits (or equivalent) in the fields specified above. The transcript must include a description of the grading system that specifies the grade range, from maximum to minimum, as well as the minimum grade required to pass the degree program.
 - (3) B2 level English certification.
- An **academic statement** of 500-700 words describing their intellectual achievements, interests and goals, including their specific reasons for wishing to pursue an MA at CeMIS.
- A **personal statement** of 500-700 words explaining how their background qualifies them for the fellowship. This **MUST** include (1) reference to the student's social and economic background, and (2) discussion of the applicant's social and/or political engagement.
- A **Curriculum Vitae**

How to apply:

Register in the application portal and upload all materials onto the application site by **JAN 15, 2022**. The application portal will open on Dec. 10, 2021. Only complete applications will be considered. Please find the portal [here](#).
