## **Research Programs and Projects**

The Courant Center continues to be involved in three structured Ph.D. programs, so-called Research Training Groups (RTG). In the RTG Scaling Problems in Statistics, the second cohort of students started last April and the renewal application for another 4 ½ years will be evaluated in July. In the RTG 'Globalization and Development', jointly organized with the University of Hannover, the first cohort of Ph.D. students will finish in early 2015 and applications for the second cohort will be reviewed in late 2014. http://www.glad.uni-hannover.de/

The trilateral project: 'Economic analysis of movement and trade restrictions and the potential for increased economic integration of agricultural markets and trade in Israel and the West Bank' that started in 2010, will be continued for a second funding period of two years until 2014.
