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Ph.D. Funding

Scholarships for Ph.D. Students working on Individual Projects

Scholarships are an important possibility to finance your Ph.D. The GGG supports you with all the information necessary to increase your chances of success in applying for scholarships. Also of course if you want to work on your doctoral thesis on your own.

Before starting your doctoral research, several important steps have to be considered. In addition to finding an advisor, and getting approved by the faculty, another chief concern is the question of how to finance your research. Many Ph.D. students work as research assistants, or for the

university administration. Others work outside the university e.g. for law firms or companies.

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Thanks to the expansion of programs like our Research Training Group, more and more such jobs and scholarships



can be offered to Ph.D. students. Especially in social sciences though, a lot of students looking to get their Ph.D. depend on special support for individual projects. Therefor the German scholarship system offers a variety of possibilities for students to receive financial support and funding (*www.begabtenfoerderungswerke.de*). But choosing from the variety of programs can be a problem, which is why most students apply for big programs (political parties, unions, Federal Ministry of Education and Research, "Stiftung des Deutschen Volkes", etc.), forgetting about smaller, lesserknown programs.

Scholarship Consulting

Starting June 2012 the GGG is going to launch an information center for Ph.D. students, looking for possibilities to finance research projects in social sciences (see page 4). In addition to basic information regarding the various scholarship programs, the information center will offer individual consulting to help students choose the right program according to their field of interest. Most importantly though, the information center offers students help preparing their application, particularly planning their research.

Throughout the last years the University of Göttingen has proven to be very successful in gaining financial funding for Ph.D.programs. The GGG alone connects 13 different Research Training Groups (RTG) and programs. Still, trying to get financial support for individual projects can be a difficult challenge. Experience shows that a lot of students have problems planning a bigger research project, even if they did learn how to write a research plan during their studies. However, creating a precise, well-structured research plan that fits the expectations of the respective foundation is of major importance for the application process.

Dr. Bettina Ross (chief administrator of the GGG) points out the importance of a well prepared application: "Besides a good idea for a research project, students need a financial resource that allows them to independently work on their thesis for several years. Finding the right scholarship program and an excellent application are key to ensure a successful Ph.D." That means that after clarifying the academically aspects with their advisor, students looking to start their doctoral thesis, should

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consider consulting the GGG for help in order to increase their chances of financial funding. Writing a research plan also eases the process of getting a thesis started, due to the additional research and planning that a good plan requires.

Planning the Application

Planning such an application one has to consider that allocating scholarships requires far in advance planning. Depending on the topic and the student's major, it takes up to three months to compile the necessary forms, including a research plan. After that it can take the different foundations up to six months to decide whether or not they grant a scholarship. Almost all foundations have application deadlines until which they accept applications. Missing those deadlines usually means another three to 12 months of waiting. Despite these inconveniences and the lack of social coverage that applicants have to face, getting into a scholarship program

can be very attractive. First of all it is sometimes the only way to get any financial support at all, but on the other hand the prestige that comes along with a scholarship cannot be underestimated. Apart



from this, recipients of financial funding usually enjoy more freedom than Ph.D. students working in companies. And in addition to financial funding a lot of foundations offer courses and special coaching as well as access to exclusive networks. To get a general idea of the possibilities there are, the "Stipendienlotse" created by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) offers an excellent overview of the variety of different programs (*www.stipendienlotse.de*).

Participating in those types of projects gives Ph.D. students the opportunity to analyze practice-oriented questions. In addition it gives them the opportunity to make contact with various employers and allows them to gain valuable insight into our regional economy system. New Sponsorships

To improve collaborations between Ph.D. students and companies, the SME-Network offers programs aiming to support students even before they start working on their Ph.D. thesis. Our goal is to increase contacts between social sciences and the market as early as possible. This is why in 2012 the SME started to support MA thesis projects that are related to regional aspects of our economy ("PraxisArbeiten").

Collaborations for future doctoral theses emerging from those practical projects can be funded by the SME-Network. The companies involved in those projects, benefit from learning about the latest approaches to solve internal issues.
