identification of key areas and requirements for sustainable action in the selected occupations and areas of competency, like retail services, sales assistance for retail services; freight forwarding and logistic services, and office management

specification of a theoretically grounded model of competent sustainable action in business-related fields

development of tasks/items for measuring competent sustainable action in business-related fields, using different formats and modes of testing

evidence-based validation of the conceptual model of competent sustainable action in business-related fields

4. Corporate Social Responsibility


