Staff mobility for teaching from the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen (UGOE), Germany to the Université Félix-Houphouët-Boigny (UFHB), Ivory Coast

General overview:

The Georg-August-Universität Göttingen (UGOE) offers in the field of Romance Philology:

- 1 Staff mobility for teaching (from UGOE to UFHB) with a duration of 10 days (excluding travel days).

A minimum of 8 hours of teaching per week has to be respected.

Staff applicants should apply for the scholarship with an invitation letter from a representative of the host university.
