Information from the GGG:

GGG's qualification program in the second quarter 2019 The GGG divides the course year into four quarters. You can sign up for courses of a quarter six weeks before the quarter starts. 12 to 16 PhD students can participate in a particular course. Places are assigned on a first come, first served basis. Four weeks before the course starts, application is considered binding. The <u>qualification program of the GGG and cooperating partners</u> includes courses about self- and social competences, competences needed for your PhD project and professional skills. In the second quarter 2019 we offer the following courses:

What kind of reactions show supervisors on that? What solutions do they have when dealing with potential problems? In her lecture Susanne Groth will be focusing on experience and knowledge from the project "PROMI – Promotion inklusive". The lecture will be in German, but discussion in English is welcome, too.
