- focused on the study of modern European society, culture and politics in a global context.

Euroculture students understand that Europe's future will be shaped not only by economics and politics, but also by struggles over identities, values, and heritage.

Why Euroculture?

International programme: Euroculture students start the Master in one of the eight European partner universities and move to a different European partner university in the second semester. Students work together with classmates from many different countries. Project-based work in intercultural teams and a strong international network upon graduation is what prepares our alumni for successful careers.

Flexible curriculum: Euroculture's interdisciplinary programme explores modern European society through history, political science, law, sociology and cultural and religious studies. Depending on which partner universities you attend, the offer of elective courses will differ, ranging from Transatlantic Relations to Postcolonial Studies to Minority Policies, and so on. There is room to tailor the curriculum to one's research interests and professional aspirations.

Chance to boost your CV:

In the third semester, students have a chance to carry out a work placement in an organization of their choice, and to gain relevant work experience. Euroculture has a large network of associated partner organizations where students can apply for placement, and coordinators offer supervision of the process.



Professional research training: Students may also choose to follow a research semester instead of a work placement. These students may go to any Euroculture university in Europe for their research semester. Selected European students may spend a research semester at one of our partner universities in India, Japan, Mexico or the United States.

Focus on employability: Alongside a carefully designed and varied theoretical curriculum, Euroculture offers practical, skills-based courses. They aim to equip students with such transferable skills as teamwork, communication, project management, etc., to prepare them for today's labour market. This helps our alumni to build careers in private consultancies, international institutions, diplomacy, NGO's, and other fields.

Small-scale teaching: In Euroculture, small-scale classes are taught by experts in their fields, who offer close supervision of students' projects. Coordinators in each partner university make sure students settle well in their new countries and help out with practical matters, as well as supervise work placements.

Excursions and summer school: Euroculture programme organizes excursions to relevant institutions or locations. At the end of the first year, all Euroculture students attend the Euroculture summer school - the so-called Intensive Programme, where students from all eight universities meet. Accommodation and participation in summer school is covered by tuition fees.
