During these days, students will be guided through the details of the study program and its four branches of specific specialities. Understanding these specialities are particularly important in terms of future carrier preferences and opportunities. As well as this, students will be walked through how to register on various university platforms and prepare their own study timetable. We will also discuss and debate why Sustainability and in particular, Sustainable Development matter. This includes playing group games, drawing links between various human needs and planetary boundaries. Moreover, there will be guidance on what should be considered as "scientific" arguments, how to navigate journal articles, and how to prepare presentations. These elements can help students with their future assignments and course works throughout the program.

As part of this preparatory course, students will get a chance to have an exclusive tour of <u>Economics & Social Sciences Divisional Library</u>.

There will be also an important session for early assessment of **English Language** skills on 20^{th} October, 15:00-17:00 pm, at <u>ZESS</u>. Students are strongly advised to take part in this assessment as this will determine their first semester English course requirements and groups.
