M.A. GLOBAL POLITICS | GRADE: 1.1

"The Diffusion of Human Rights in the Treaties of Regional Organisations." Do Inter-Organisational Networks Matter?"

A social network analysis of data from the Comparative Regional Organizations Project (CROP) reveals that regional organisations are more likely to reference human rights in their fundamental treaties when they are more connected to organisations already doing so. However, this effect is not uniform across all types of human rights.

"The Influence of Partisanship on Personnel Contributions of Democratic States in UN Peacekeeping Operations"

A panel regression of troop contributions to UN peacekeeping operations between 1990 and 2011 shows that economically left-wing and culturally green-alternative-libertarian governments contribute slightly more personnel than their right-wing and traditionalist-authoritarian-nationalist counterparts.
