If you are writing your thesis in German, but are not a German

native speaker, you may apply for editing funding as a GGG member. Your thesis should be completed textually during editing but not have been submitted to the faculty. Funding covers an acknowledged editor's fee working with you on error control and linguistic improvement of the text. Applications may be filed each for the following half-year. Next application deadlines are 30.06. and 30.09.2016. Detailed information can be found here.
