

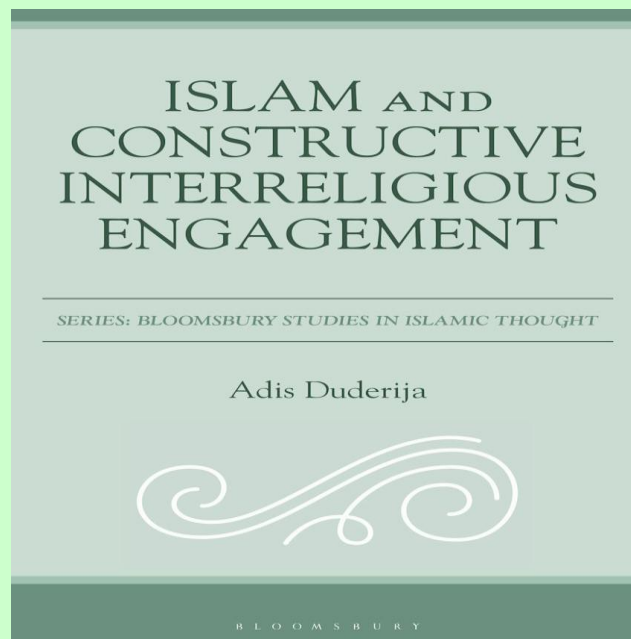

ABSTRACT: How does the Islamic tradition create space for – and resist – constructive interreligious dialogue? Drawing on his new book, *Islam and Constructive Interreligious Engagement*, Adis Duderija explores the conditions necessary for meaningful interreligious dialogue, comparative theological learning, and theological growth within an Islamic framework. Engaging the work of Catherine Cornille, the lecture examines the Qur'an, hadith, and major Islamic theological doctrines including *takfir*, *tashabbuh bi-l-kuffar*, *bid'a*, and *al-wala' wa-l-bara'* through the lens of comparative theology. The lecture also explores Muslim engagement with Christianity and Buddhism through the thought of leading contemporary Muslim scholars, including Mahmoud Ayoub, Ismail Al-Faruqi, Shabbir Akhtar, Imtiyaz Yusuf, Mona Siddiqui, Mouhanad Khorchide, and Muna Tatari. Topics include Islam and comparative theology; theological humility and religious diversity; Islamic orthodoxy and interfaith engagement; Muslim-Christian and Muslim-Buddhist dialogue; and constructive approaches to religious pluralism.
