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Helpdesk highlights: travelling, chatting and cooking with the GGG

Judith Kaschner has been working at the Helpdesk for International PhD students of the Göttingen Graduate School of Social Sciences (GGG) since April 1, 2014. In the following, she reports on her experiences.

By now the Helpdesk can look back on two eventful years. First and foremost, the Helpdesk is the contact point for general questions and information on life in Germany that newly arrived PhD students are usually occupied with. Most questions are about insurances or authority details, other frequent issues are German classes, shopping facilities, finding a job or a suitable apartment.

Besides, the Helpdesk organizes various activities, thus providing opportunities to get to know Germany better, and Göttingen in particular: our own events and cooperations with Göttingen International, Foyer International and "Dorfmoderation Südniedersachsen" allow our international PhD students a wide range of insights into German landscape, culture, and mentality. As German PhD students are also welcome to our events, there is plenty of room for getting in contact with each other and participants are always joking and discussing at length. These events are quite varied, both in terms of group size and their composition. The issues are very individual as well: for example, at the request of a Chinese PhD student, we took a trip to the local supermarket, explaining German food such as sausages and dairy products with a particular focus on their ingredients, production and storage. Thanks to the generous staff we also had a little tasting at the deli counter. We certainly could have stayed there for another few hours, as there was no shortage of questions and topics for discussion!

Our trips to the small villages around Göttingen, being organized in cooperation with Rhea Braunwalder (Dorfmoderation Südniedersachsen), are also quite unique. The focus is on differences between rural and urban living and housing situations as well as the

history and features of the particular villages. When local residents invite us into their houses or contemporary witnesses talk about historical incidents, these visits result in particularly close contacts.



We were thus able to visit the former dairy in Spanbeck, which is a regular house today, and were told the story of an old inn that has been refurbished painstakingly. In Reyershausen, a former employee of the now decommissioned pot-

ash mine showed us a small room that honors the mining history of the place with artifacts, pictures and, notably, stories. But modern village life does not go short either: we saw cattle of the endangered race Harzer Rotes Höhenvieh (Harz red cattle) in Spanbeck, being kept in cooperation by four families, and we also got insights into the stables of Plesse-Milch GmbH in Reyershausen, which is a huge milking plant for more than 600 cows. Every visit to a village is different, but what they have in common is the individual interaction with the villagers who open their doors for us and get to know PhD students and students from all over the world in return.

We also arrange excursions to cities and places that are farther away. Towns with well-preserved historic centers are particularly popular, such as Goslar, where we visited the local renaissance fair and learned about the art of beer production in an exclusive guided tour through a brewery. Characteristic landscapes can be thoroughly explored on day trips: we thus retraced Goethe's tracks on a hiking tour in Harz that had been organized in cooperation with Göttingen International and had a romantic ride with the historical steam locomotive afterwards.

Several theme nights are organized in Göttingen throughout the year to give our international PhD students mutual insights into the respective traditions and customs. Naturally, there is more to these evenings than dry theory – the focus lies on giving things a try, for example at the Christmas baking at Foyer International: mixing, kneading, baking and decorating turned out to be a huge success – as was discussing about Christmas spices and music, and tasting the baking results, of course.

New regulations for PhD students of Forestry and Agricultural Sciences

The Graduate School Forest and Agricultural Sciences (GFA) was opened in October 2015 at Göttingen University (*www.uni-goettingen.de/en/525367.html*). The founding of this 4th graduate school ensures that every PhD student has access to a competent graduate school. The key strength of the Göttingen model of graduate schools is that the graduate schools are oriented towards the different subject cultures while also cooperating on an interdisciplinary level.

For PhD students of Forestry and Agricultural Sciences, this means:

- PhD students who have been GGG members up to now will remain members.
- PhD students in the Research Training Group "Global Food" are and will become GGG members.

New PhD students of Forestry and Agricultural Sciences as of October 2015, please note the following:

- PhD students of Forestry and Agricultural Sciences starting their PhD as of October 2015 are members of the GFA.
- It is currently being debated whether you can become a member of GGG nevertheless. Please note further information on the GGG website that will be available by the end of February (*www.uni-goettingen.de/en/530661.html*).
- According to the new doctoral degree regulations, you directly apply for admission at the GFA or faculty.

The primary membership in the GGG gives you full access to all GGG courses, measures and subsidies. If you are a member of GFA, you can use the course offers of the GGG if there are still vacancies (waiting list) or if you wish to attend an event held in cooperation with the GFA.

Presentation of the candidates for the PhD students' representatives' election

The GGG PhD representative is an important contact person for PhD students of social sciences and will be their representative within the graduate school, the university, and in public. During the one-year term of office, the PhD representative actively helps shaping the graduate school as a member of its board and represents the interests of the various PhD students of social sciences.

The next **PhD students' representatives' election** of the GGG will take place **online** from **March 1 to 27, 2016**. You will thus receive an e-mail from the GGG as of March 1, including access data and the corresponding link. The new term of office will be from April 2016 until March 2017.

It turned out that the current representation would like to run for office again, while no other candidates have come forward. Julia Gumula

Personal details:

I am doing my PhD at the Georg Elias Müller Institute for Psychology in the Social and Communication Psychology Department under the supervision of Prof. Dr. Margarete Boos. In my PhD project I explore the influence of major changes of perspective in idea development processes on the quality of the ideas in an experimental way. Luckily, I am a grant holder of the Hans Böckler foundation. I would not have been able to finance my PhD project by any other means, as I am also a mother of three children.

Before starting my PhD project, I co-founded and coordinated a binational master study program at the Otto von Guericke University in Magdeburg in cooperation with the Pedagogical University in Mozambique. I have been a PhD students' representative at the university in Magdeburg as well.

I studied cultural engineering: cultural studies, knowledge management, and logistics.

Candidacy details:

The amendment of the Lower Saxony Higher Education Act has brought about some changes last year. PhD students finally have a status at universities and can now be represented by their peers within the committees and organs of higher education self-administration. The PhD students' representatives of the graduate schools have been working on developing a construct for every faculty of Göttingen University with great commitment for more than a year. I established a network with the PhD students' representations of the universities in Leipzig, Halle, and Jena back when I was a PhD students' spokesperson at the University of Magdeburg, and we are benefitting from this network in building a local PhD students' representation for the whole university.

In the coming term of office I intend to be in frequent contact with my fellow PhD students. Additionally, I am still fighting for a (even more) family-friendly university with free childcare for PhD students with children. And we will keep helping to form the PhD students' representation for the whole university, so that the interests of PhD students who do not feel represented by either the junior academic staff or the student body are given a voice in the senate and the faculty council.

Rüdiger Hesse

Personal details:

I am a grant holder of the Hans Böckler foundation and member of the Research Training Group "Qualifikatorisches Upgrading in KMU – Fachkräftebedarf und Akademisierung im Mittelstand" ("Qualification Upgrading in SME – Demand for Skilled Labor and Academization in the Middle Class") and doing my PhD at the Chair of Business Education and Human Resources Development. My thesis deals with the employability of students graduating from universities with Bachelor degrees. I explore the students' educational aspiration and typical contextual structures in terms of labor market integration. My social sciences studies at Göttingen University had already been interdisciplinary. Moreover, I spent a year abroad at the University of Uppsala (Sweden). Furthermore, I am currently involved in the work of the National Report on Education as a research associate, describing the effects and returns of education.

Candidacy details:

We PhD students will have to make a choice, sooner or later, about what road we will continue to take professionally. Therefore, increasing the availability of information on the many possibilities for PhD graduates is very important to me. To this end, I represented the interests of the PhD students in both the "AG Promorat" (work group "PhD council") and "AG Karrierewege" (work group on careers) in the past legislation period of the GGG's PhD representation. On the one hand, I would like to update, extend and spread the presentation of ways to the "dream job" scientist. On the other hand, the perspectives in free economy need to be focused more strongly, also on a local basis in terms of small and medium enterprises. This is why I would like to actively inform about the modalities of the respective employment situation and contribute to the successful transition to the labor market. Moreover, as PhD students' spokesperson, I would like to continue vehemently advocating for improvement of our research and working conditions. Therefore, the agenda for the next term of office should include a critical approach to the excellence initiative. Another objective is to provide for continued employment, in order to better guarantee the guality of research and teaching.
