



Switzerland, a multilingual country in the heart of Europe, is known for its high level of academic training. The University of Neuchâtel (UniNE) is located in the French speaking part of Switzerland, in a city that enjoys a central location: it is half an hour by train from the federal capital, Bern, and just over an hour from the economic capital of Zürich or the international city of Geneva. The WELCOME TO NEUCHÂTELI city of Paris is also only less than four hours away. Nestled in the foot of the mountains of the Jura, Neuchâtel faces the lake and offers a magnificent view of the Alps. The landscape, climate, cultural and social life are all factors that make the area of Neuchâtel (about 90,000 people)

Language of instruction

French is the main language of instruction in the Bachelor programs, with a recommended level of B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). English, German, and Spanish are practiced in the programs concerning Language and Literature fields.

French remains the main language of instruction in the Master; however English and German are also used in some courses or even in full programs.

Language Courses

In addition to offering full or part-time programs, the Institute of French Language and Culture offers free French lessons of two hours per week to non-French speaking students at A1, A2 and B1-B2-C1 levels, with a language laboratory and exercises in German-French or English-French translation.

The Language Centre offers not only courses in English and German but also multimedia self-learning language programs (in English, German, Italian and Spanish).

Culture

Theaters, concert halls, museums, cinemas ... Neuchâtel has a taste for culture. Two major festivals punctuate the year: the Festi'Neuch, which celebrates contemporary music on the lake and the International Fantastic Film Festival (NIFFF) an event which is both provocative and amusing. Within the University, there are possibilities to invest free time into a choice of two excellent theater companies, to participate in two classic choirs, or even join the film club.

Sport

Where sports are concerned, approximately 110 courses and more than 50 different disciplines are offered each week. Note that, both in winter and summer, Neuchâtel's geographical location allows for the practice of a multitude of outdoor sports including skiing, snowshoeing, golf, tennis, and sailing just to name a few. Beyond «classic» sports, fitness included, UniNE also provides access to more rare disciplines such as aikido, capoeira and different types of dance activities. A wide range of activities, aimed primarily at health, are also proposed. Most sports programs are free or offered at very competitive prices.

Exchange programs (Mobility)

Not only does UniNE have more than a hundred cooperation agreements with Universities around the world, but it also welcomes over a hundred exchange students every year, in the range of courses it offers. Students from universities with which UniNE has not signed any formal partnership are also welcome.

The supervision of exchange students is guaranteed by an immersion course that takes place during the 10 days preceding each semester. The Neuchâtel section of the Erasmus Student Network organizes many activities during this course as well as during the semester. The Buddy Program offers exchange students personalized support upon arrival in Neuchâtel and during the first weeks.

Accommodation & Budget

Rooms and studios, near university buildings and public transport, are available for students in Neuchâtel. Other opportunities exist in neighboring cities. One needs to count between CHF 400.- to 600.- per month for rent (approximately € 320.- to 480.-). The monthly estimated expenditure for a student in Neuchâtel is between CHF 1600.- and 2600.- (approximately € 1290.- to 2100.-) excluding tuition fees.

Formalities

- Visa: non-European students must apply for a visa to stay in Switzerland. The visa application must be submitted at least three months before the start of classes. Depending on the country of origin, a financial guarantee is sometimes required but this is not the case for exchange students.
- Health Insurance: All students must be insured against sickness and accidents.
 Sometimes an insurance policy, from the home country, especially for Europeans, is sufficient. When this is not the case, students must have a Swiss health insurance.

Registration Fees

- The semester fees for foreign students
 those whose parents are living abroad amount to CHF 790.- (or CHF 515.- for Swiss)
- Exchange students (studying one or two semesters without getting UniNE grades) are exempt from registration fees.

Fulltime studies registration

Students who wish to enroll in UniNE for a Bachelor, Master or Doctorate file their application for registration by April 30th to begin in the Fall semester and by November 30th for the Spring semester. The conditions and procedure for admission are detailed on www.unine.ch/admission

Exchange students registration (Mobility)

Students, from partner universities, who wish to participate in an exchange with the UniNE should initially contact the International Relations Office in their home university. We will then be informed of the candidacy before April 15 for an exchange for the Fall semester and before September 15 for an exchange starting in the Spring semester.
