Evaluation of the Göttingen Graduate School of Social Sciences

Which wishes and preferences did you communicate? What should be improved now?

In the course of the last months, the GGG has analyzed previous experiences from five years: By surveying all members, data evaluation and joint discussions, it became apparent what has been established successfully so far and where potential for development can be seen.

The evaluation of the GGG consisted mainly of four elements: an online poll of all graduating and supervising members in September 2013, the analysis of membership data and acceptance of GGG measures of the last five years, assessment by external experts as well as several debates on aims and measures of the GGG.

The quality and attraction of all GGG activities was analyzed:

- the qualification programs (like courses and the "Praxisforscher"),
- the funding possibilities (like the family-oriented finishing grants, support of conference organizations and travel grants),
- the interdisciplinary interconnection of PhD-students (e.g. in the PhD forum),
- the advisory service for PhD-students in case of crisis during dissertation or for questions concerning financing,
- the installation and supervision of new PhD programs,
- as well as the collaboration with the faculties for quality management during dissertation.

This evaluation was carried out by an accessory group that consisted of the PhDrepresentatives, the executive board, educational deans and employees. The process was critically accompanied by an external group of experts from graduate schools of other universities and the PhD student group of the trade union GEW.

GGG indeed always evaluates its measures in the current year as well. However, this comprehensive evaluation offers us the chance to review quality, gaps and potential for improvement concerning the support of a PhD in social sciences from a broader perspective and to develop further measures. It has now become very clear how advanced the GGG is, how cooperation can be improved and which areas have to be developed further.

Interim results and creative leeway

At this juncture, some interim results can be seen, which invite for further shaping of the GGG at which we would like you to participate. We are open to your wishes, ideas and further suggestions.

GGG's offers of courses, grants and counseling were assessed as very useful for the PhD-students. These strengths of the GGG in the areas qualification and counseling of PhD-students should therefore be assured and even better communicated.

In other areas, potential for development is visible, which will be concretized together with you, the presidential board, the faculties and the GGG executive board in the weeks and months to come:

In particular, access to research, teaching and life in Göttingen should be further facilitated for international PhD-students. For this purpose, the present Helpdesk for International PhD-students should be set on

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a broader basis with more opportunities for action. Additional measures will be to expand cooperation with Göttingen International as well as to secure German and English bilingualism more strictly.

Potential for development became also clear in the area of providing professional competencies for academic and non-academic career paths. Besides research, good scientific practice, self-competence and social competence as well as teaching skills are also crucial for this step. Here, the GGG (together with the Division for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education and other cooperating institutions) offers a broad portfolio. As far as qualification and networking offers for PhD-students who aim at careers outside of academia are concerned, the already existing offers of the SME-network of the GGG and the mentoring program KaWirMento will have to be further evolved. In addition, based on the mentoring program WeWi-Mento, development directions for careers in e.g. university management, ministries and unions are being discussed.

The perception of GGG measures by the PhD-students, professors and the university departments as well as our communication with them should be improved, too. For this purpose, on the one hand, the information material of the GGG will be revised in 2014. On the other hand, GGG participates actively in local networks for counseling and promotion of young talents as well as in nationwide networks of graduate centers and PhD-students. Last but not least, the

cooperation of faculties with the GGG will be further developed.

While reading, you will notice that many of the measures are still being discussed and designed. The described development directions will turn into further measures in the following months. As PhD-students, supervisors and members of our university you are a part of this process. We are looking forward to your suggestions.
