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My year in the WeWiMento program

Mentee Paul Becker (PhD student at the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity and member of the GGG) reports on his experiences in the mentoring program "Paths into Science Management (WeWiMento)" in the second round 2014/2015.

Two years ago the Coordination Mentoring of Göttingen University - together with the graduate schools GSGG and GGG - launched the mentoring program "Paths into Science Management" (WeWiMento). The aim of the program is to open up employment perspectives in science management for postdocs and PhD students in the final phase of their doctorate and to answer their questions on this professional field. Workshops and job shadowing possibilities in the different university departments, as well as the accompanying mentoring by experienced university and non-university employees provide participants with lots of ideas for their future career planning. The one-year program focuses on three main topics: Oneto-one mentoring, job shadowing and qualification and networking.

After successful application and an interview, I participated in the second round of the program together with eleven colleagues. The program started on February 5, 2015 with a social gathering and an introduction round of the program organizers, the mentees and their mentors. Subsequently, there was an official kick-off event at which all mentees introduced themselves together with their mentors. In the first half of the program we took part in three two-day workshops on "Career entry and career planning", "Potential assessment" and "Working at interfaces and in networks".

All workshops were very practice-oriented and helped us enormously with questions on career orientation, recognizing our own potential and on the meaning of building and maintaining networks.

In April the different opportunities for job shadowing at Göttingen University - one of them at the GGG - were presented in a collective meeting. Each of us could choose three to four job shadowing positions that were best suited for our personal interests, questions and likings. We joined every chosen position for one week. In agreement with the organizers at the different positions, we could either complete the job shadowing in a row or split the visit into several one- or two-day units. Thus, we gained deep insights into the operation of the university and into the processes and daily tasks at the single job shadowing positions. We also had the possibility to ask all questions on a career in science management in an open and cooperative atmosphere.

In addition to the workshops, we regularly organized meetings on our own, either with the whole group or in smaller teams for the mutual exchange of experiences. We grew quickly together as a group and provided mutual support for all upcoming issues. We also built up friendly relations with the mentees of the first round. Furthermore, all mentees were supervised in a one-to-one mentoring by mentors with sound experience in science management over the whole duration of the program. We met them regularly and discussed all our questions on career planning, application documents and much more. My result of the WeWiMento year: In case one of you is thinking about a potential career in science management, this program definitely offers a lot of answers to questions related to a career in this professional field. Even better: Two of our mentees have been hired in science management even before the end of the program. A retrospective on the Methodological Week 2015

This year's Methodological Week, which was attended by 41 PhD students, took place from 14.09. to 17.09.2015. Thirty-one participants took part in the evaluation of the Methodological Week (response rate of around 76%), which allows a well-grounded assessment of the event. The workshops were rated with 2.0 on average (equivalent to school grades 1 to 5, 1 being best), the keynote speech with 2.2 and the lecturers with 1.9. The overall rating, also taking into account the organization, was 2.0 on average.

The comments often appreciated the organization and the onsite management, which motivates us to maintain and extend the service we have established so far. Furthermore, we would like to thank you for the numerous advices on the course contents and on wishes for further courses, which will be very helpful to us in the organization of the Methodological Week 2016!

The concept of the Methodological Week, which was designed for multidisciplinarity, was also approved while at the same time it became clear from the evaluation comments that many participants had wished for a stronger networking among each other. To respond to this wish we plan an additional – voluntary – evening event during the Methodological Week 2016. It will be open to all participants of the Methodological Week who wish for stronger networking among each other and with the employees of the GGG.

Information for Newcomers

Here, we provide information at irregular intervals for PhD students who just started their dissertation or are new in the GGG. Even though intended for newcomers mainly, this column also contains information relevant to experienced PhD students.

First, we would like to warmly welcome you! As the Graduate School of Social Sciences, we will accompany you during your PhD and do our utmost to support you.

Admission to a doctorate

You will find comprehensive and combined information on the first steps from admission to a doctorate to enrollment on the website of the Office for Student Affairs.

All questions on prerequisites, deadlines for application, recognition of academic degrees and the PhD procedure will be answered by the deanery or the Study advisory office of the respective faculty.

After you found a professor who will supervise your PhD, please clarify financing e. g. with your supervisor. Dr. Kristin Schröder from the GGG PhD-Funding Guidance offers you advice concerning the search for funding possibilities.

After admission at your faculty, please enroll at the university's Registrar's Office. Enrollment is mandatory for PhD students, too.

Doctoral studies

There are three ways to a doctorate in social sciences at Göttingen University:

- individual doctoral degree at the Faculty of Law,
- within a PhD degree program at the Faculties of Agricultural Sciences, Forest Sciences, Social Sciences or Economic Sciences or
- within a program, e. g. a research training group.

To earn an *individual doctoral degree*, you write your dissertation at the chair of your professor at the Faculty of Law.

In a *PhD degree program* you undergo a structured study program next to writing your dissertation or your scientific papers (cumulative PhD), respectively. You attend method and key skill courses as well as colloquia for usually 20 credits. In the four mentioned faculties in Göttingen, there is only this form of doctoral studies.

A *program* groups PhD students to a specific topic. These groups work interdisciplinary and cross-institutional. You can find the current programs which are members of the GGG online.

It is recommended or mandatory (depending on whether you chose individual or structured doctoral studies) that you enter into a PhD agreement with your supervisor which defines start, topic and the involved parties of your PhD. You should regularly discuss the progress of your work with your supervisor, at least once a year. These discussions should also adress the compliance of good scientific practice. This is a negotiated agreement in science. To avoid scientific misconduct, Göttingen University and the DFG have published a collection of recommendations.

In PhD degree programs or in a program you are not only accompanied by one person but by a thesis committee. This committee comprises at least two, usually three PhD supervisors and you. Its purpose is that you regularly speak about the progress of your PhD and that you come to a solution together in case of difficulties. All doctoral studies have in common that the dissertation is submitted to the faculty and that the oral final exam is taken at the faculty. The respective deanery thus accompanies all formal steps of your PhD.

Support by the GGG

You are automatically a member of GGG as soon as you are admitted to a doctorate in one of the PhD degree programs, at the Faculty of Law, Social Sciences or Economic Sciences or at parts of the Faculty of Agricultural or Forest Sciences and Forest Ecology..

We kindly ask you to send our questionnaire to the GGG right at the beginning – and to update it if needed – to allow us to contact you. These data will only be used within the GGG.

There are no additional obligations associated with your membership. In fact, you have access to:

- the GGG course program,
- the GGG counseling offers,
- the Helpdesk for International PhD students as well as
- GGG funding measures.

You will find an overview of the GGG team, our offers and application deadlines on the GGG homepage (*www.ggg. uni-goettingen.de*) and in the newsletter at hand. If you are registered at GGG, you will receive the newsletter automatically. Should this not be the case, please send us an email – for example if you belong to the university staff and want to receive this newsletter as well.
