## The Representation of Violence in the American Literature of 20th Century : a Girardian Reading

My investigation is divided into three interrelated segments that each of them covers a specific image of violence in the contemporary American literature of the  $20^{\rm th}$  century . Fanaticism , Racism and Sexism are the three main categories of this dissertation , for which I have chosen three main American Authors from three different era of the  $20^{\rm th}$  century : William Faulkner , Flannery O'Connor and Cormac McCarthy . Each of these three authors are represented by two prosaic works --respectively --  $As\ I\ Lay\ Dying$  and  $The\ Light\ in\ August$  ,  $The\ Violent\ Bear\ it\ Away$  and  $Wise\ Blood$  ,  $Blood\ Meridian$  and  $Child\ of\ God$  . The approach of this study is based on the theories of the René Girard , the French philosopher of the  $20^{\rm th}$  and  $21^{\rm st}$  century . His theory of the mimesis , as an instance , is a brand-new perspective , though cemented by the Greek and Roman mythology , that introduces the object of desire as the main trigger for almost every case of violence that has ever occurred .
