Modules from the language offerings of the university can be selected, provided they offer a language level equivalent to level B according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), and provided the modules have not already been credited in a previously

completed degree program. Contrary to the first sentence, modules in the English language and the student's native language are excluded from being considered.

f. Elective area: German as a Foreign Language (0 - 12 ECTS credits) (only for students without German as their native language, a German-language higher education entrance qualification, or a German-language Bachelor's degree, at least level A1.2 or higher, offering as listed by the German as a Foreign Language department)

Students who did not obtain their university entrance qualification in the Federal Republic of Germany or in a country or region where German is an official language, and for whom the program that formed the basis for admission to the Master's program "Development Economics" is not taught in German, may also earn 12 ECTS credits in the elective area by successfully completing modules from the "German as a Foreign Language" offerings. Modules from level "Basic Level II" (A.1.2) or higher may be credited.

g. Elective area: Certificate program "Technical and Literary Translation" SK.FLÜ (18 ECTS credits) (provided access requirements are met; partial credits cannot be transferred)

The certificate program "Technical and Literary Translation" (SK.FLÜ) can be selected for 18 ECTS credits, provided the required access qualifications are met. Partial credits from the program cannot be transferred.
