What do I need to create a timetable?

To create a timetable, you need four tools:



Exemplary study plan
Module catalogue
Course catalogue in HISinOne EXA
Stud.IP

Scan QR-Code for video tutorial





How do I go about creating a timetable?

Please note in general:

First plan the smaller subject and then plan the larger subject around the small subject! In larger subjects you have more choice of courses, as they are often offered at different times.

Examples of larger subjects:

- German Studies
- English: Language, Literatures and Cultures/ Englisch
- History
- Philosophy

Where can I find an exemplary study plan?

You can find an exemplary study plan for your subject in the **"Fachspezifischen Bestimmungen der Prüfungs- und Studienordnung"** of the respective subject. You can find this document by clicking on your subject <u>in the A-Z-list</u> under the item **"Regulations"**.

Please open the latest version. At the end of the document you will find one or more exemplary, i.e. sample, study plans. These are suggestions as to the order in which the modules* can be studied. In the next step, you have to find out which courses you have to take for a module. You can find this information in the module catalogue.

* Relevant terms related to the study program are explained in a glossary.

Where can I find the module catalogue?

You wil find the module catalogue that is currently valid for you on the same page as the **"Fachspezifischen Bestimmungen".** In the module catalogue, you will find the core curriculum of the respective subject under the indication **"Übersicht nach Modulgruppen**". The core curriculum defines the modules that you must complete in order to graduate with 66 C in each of your subject. Click on the module in the PDF that you have selected in the exemplary study plan. This will take you to the module description.

This contains important Information, including:

- Name of the module
- Number of Credits
- Courses
- Examination/ Examination prerequisites
- Frequency and duration
- Admission requirements

When and where do the courses take place?

From the module description you now know which courses belong to the module. The courses are entered in HISinOne

For eCampus scan QR Code:



EXA. Log in via <u>eCampus</u> and select the course catalogue. Then click on "Faculty of Humanities" and then on your respective subject. Now look for the corresponding courses. Always check whether the course is really assigned to the module you would like to take.

If available, please also read the remarks and the commentary carefully, as important information is iften contained here, e.g. on the registration modalities.

5) Where do I have to register?

You must register for the courses via StudIP. Please note the information on the respective registration modalities in HISinOne EXA. You can also access Stud.IP via <u>eCampus</u>. You can find instruction videos on StudIP <u>here</u>.

Often you can register for courses during certain time slots only. If you have questions about registration, please contact the respective lecturer or your subject.

Please note that registration in Stud.IP does not replace registration in FlexNow. If you want to take an exam, you must also register for it in FlexNow in time.

Examination dates are usually shown in HISinOne EXA.
