Part 1: Göttingen Symposium on Molecular Zoology

In a 2-day symposium, we want to bring together international scientists working on understanding the function of genes underlying all kinds of zoological phenomena.

Target group: PhD students or postdocs working on a project with an emerging animal model with a focus on protostomes. Up to five Master students will be selected to join the symposium.
