Following the resolution of the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Humanities on 21.06.2023, the Presidential Board of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen approved on 13.10.2023 the tenth amendment of the examination and study regulations for the consecutive Master's degree programme „Arabic-Islamic Studies“ in the version published on 06.10.2011 (Official Announcements I no. 9/2011 p. 530), last amended by resolution of the Presidential Board on 25.05.2022 (Official Announcements I no. 26/2022 p. 481), approved (§ 44 section 1 sentence 2 NHG in the version published on 26.02.2007 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 69), last amended by Article 7 of the Act dated 23.03.2022 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 218); §§ 37 section 1 sentence 3 no. 5 b), 44 section 1 sentence 3 NHG).

**Examination and study regulations
for the consecutive Master's degree programme „Arabic-Islamic Studies“
at the University of Göttingen**

§ 1 Scope

- (1) The provisions of the "General Examination Regulations for Bachelor's and Master's Programmes and Other Study Programmes at the University of Göttingen" (APO) as well as the "Framework examination regulations for Master's degree programmes of the Faculty of Humanities" in their respective valid version apply to the Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies" at the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen.
- (2) These regulations govern the further provisions for the completion of the Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies".

§ 2 Aims of the study programme; professional fields

- (1) ¹The academic field of Arabic-Islamic Studies deals with history and culture, religion and intellectual history, law, the literatures as well as questions of secularity in the Islamic world with special consideration of the Arab countries. ²Earlier eras are covered as well as modern developments. ³Great importance is attached to teaching in-depth Arabic language skills as a prerequisite for source-orientated academic work and with a view to graduates' future career

opportunities.⁴ By learning another language of the Islamic cultural area or another Semitic language, the view of the Islamic world is expanded geographically or deepened historically.

(2) The Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies" prepares students for the following fields of activity:

- a) Further qualification in the academic field and related activities in research and teaching.
- b) Activities in the diplomatic service, national and international organisations, and in companies.
- c) Activities in cultural mediation fields, such as museums, libraries, and publishing houses.

(3) ¹The Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies" serves both academic and nonacademic qualifications. ²Students demonstrate problem-solving skills in the study of the history and culture of Islam, the religion of Islam, Arabic literature, Islamic law, and issues of secularism in the Arab world. ³The focus is on original texts that are of fundamental importance for understanding the religious, intellectual, and cultural history of Islam. ⁴Students are introduced to current methodological issues and the international state of research in Arabic and Islamic Studies. ⁵They gain specialised knowledge and a critical understanding of the larger context of the development of Islam as a religion and a way of life. ⁶In language exercises, students deepen their passive and active command of the Arabic language. ⁷Learning another language of the Islamic cultural area or a second Semitic language enables students to interpret non-Arabic sources on Islamic intellectual and cultural history.

(4) The examinations during the Master's degree programme determine whether the candidate has acquired the specialist knowledge and skills required for the study objectives, has an overview of the relevant specialist contexts and has the ability to work according to scientific principles, to convey scientific knowledge and to reflect on and assess acquired knowledge and skills with regard to application contexts.

(5) ¹In the Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies", students not only acquire specialised knowledge in a socio-politically highly topical field, but they are also encouraged to engage in civil society. ²Students are encouraged to contribute to debates on the integration of migrants and the teaching of core democratic values such as human rights and tolerance. ³In order to promote civil courage and socially engaged personalities, the following specific courses are available in this degree programme: M.Ara.504 "History and Culture of Islam" and M.Ara.505 "Religion of Islam", M.Ara.604 "Secular Modernity and Islam" and SK.Ara.702 "Arabic-Islamic Studies Abroad". ⁴Students are especially trained in responsible action, independent thinking,

comprehensive specialised knowledge, and reflection on political, social, and cultural events.⁵ The following competencies in particular are promoted:

- Cultural understanding and intercultural competence: The courses on Arabic literature train the students' awareness of the creative inclusion of historical and political topics, but also of the contemporary historical conditionality of literature. This creates an awareness of the culture of Islamic countries beyond religion, which can be productively introduced into socio-political debates and contribute to intercultural understanding.
- Creative thinking, self-determination and personality development: The high degree of self-determination through the broad range of choices and in the area of key competencies contributes to personality development, encourages initiative and creative thinking.

§ 2 a Recommended previous knowledge

¹If you are enrolled in an English-language study option or an English-language specialisation, basic knowledge of German is strongly recommended. ²Students with a lower level of German language skills are strongly recommended to take German courses in the compulsory elective or professionalisation area.

§ 3 Structure of the course of study; course contents and course of study

- (1) The programme begins in the winter semester.
- (2) The degree programme is not suitable for part-time study.
- (3) The degree programme comprises 120 credits (ECTS credits; abbreviated: C), which are distributed as follows:
 - a. core subject studies 78 C:
 - aa. „Arabic-Islamic Studies“ (German-language study option) or „Arabic-Islamic Studies“ (English-language study option) amounting to 78 C
 - bb. „Arabic-Islamic Studies“ (German-language study option) or „Arabic-Islamic Studies“ (English-language study option) amounting to 42 C combined with an approved module package in a different subject amounting to 36 C or with two approved module packages in a different subject amounting to 18 C each, or
 - b. professionalisation area 12 C;
 - c. Master's thesis 30 C.

²The language of instruction and examination of the respective study option can be taken from the designations in the module overview.

(4)¹ The study- and examination-related achievements are to be completed in compulsory, compulsory elective and elective modules. ²They are specified in a binding manner in the module overview (appendix I). ³For recommendation on the appropriate structure of the course of studies,

please refer to the sample curriculums enclosed in appendix II. ⁴The list of modules is published separately; it is part of these regulations insofar as the modules are listed in the module directory (appendix I).

(5) ¹The core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" or "Arabic-Islamic Studies" with a total of 78 C includes a study focus in "Islamic law" (in German) or a study focus in "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World" (in English). ²In the core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" with a total of 42 C, a study focus in "Islamic law" (in German) can be taken. ³The core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" with a total of 42 C includes a study focus in "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World" (in English). ⁴The module overview regulates the details.

(6) ¹In the core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" (German-language study option) with a total of 42 C, students complete three modules in the first three semesters from the available subject areas of History and Culture of Islam, Religion of Islam, Arabic Literature, Islamic Law and Arabic Language Practice. ²In parallel, students acquire in-depth knowledge of grammar and lexis in the first year of study. ³Students are able to actively use the language. ⁴In the master colloquium, candidates develop a concept for their final thesis. ⁵The study programme also includes solid basic knowledge of another language of the Islamic cultural area (e.g. Turkish or Persian) or of the Semitic language family (e.g. Syriac, Biblical Hebrew or Modern Hebrew) totalling 12 C.

(7) ¹In the core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" comprising 78 C with the study focus "Islamic law" comprising 44 C, students acquire extensive knowledge of legal theory and legal practice. ²They deal with various topics from the field of Islamic law. ³They are introduced to research on the religion of Islam and Islamic law and learn to independently develop questions that are relevant to modern legal discourse. ⁴The module "Technical Language, Legal Terminology" focuses on an intensive diachronic and synchronic examination of legal terminology. ⁵The extensive integration of central events of the Faculty of Law and the simultaneously very high requirements of Arabic language skills enable students to quickly recognize Islamic legal texts from these areas, to analyze them and to classify them in their contemporary contexts.

(8) ¹In the core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" comprising 42 C with the study focus "Islamic law", students acquire comprehensive legal-theoretical and legal-practical knowledge of subject areas of Islamic law. ²Through the integration of the module "Technical Language, Legal Language", the second Semitic language is omitted. ³Further, courses from the law faculty sharpen the requirement profile.

(9) ¹In the core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" comprising 78 C with the study focus "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World" comprising 50 C, students acquire extensive specialised knowledge of the intellectual history of the Arab world from late antiquity to modern times. ²They will deal with the areas of history, culture and religion of the Arab-Islamic world. ³They will be introduced to research on the Hadith, ethics and education, and secularism, and will learn to independently develop and answer questions relevant to intellectual history as well as to understanding current discourses in Islamic studies and society in the Arab-Islamic world. ⁴The module "Hadith Studies" focuses on the teaching and application of innovative isnad-cum-matn analysis. ⁵The module "Ethics and Education in Islam" explores the foundations and developments of religious, social and scientific phenomena that have defined Islamic societies up to the modern age. ⁶The module "Secular Modernity and Islam" focuses on discourses and phenomena from the 20th and 21st centuries at the intersection of secularity and Islam. ⁷Continuous cooperation with the Faculty of Theology and partner universities in the Arab and Islamic world is an important building block for promoting students' linguistic, intercultural and interdisciplinary competencies.

(10) ¹In the 42 C Arabic-Islamic Studies degree programme with the specialisation "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World", students acquire comprehensive specialist knowledge of the intellectual history of the Arab world from late antiquity to the modern era. ²In the first three semesters, students complete three modules from the following subject areas: Hadith Studies, Ethics and Education, Secularism and Arabic Literature. ³In the first year of study, students acquire in-depth knowledge of grammar and lexis in parallel. ⁴Students can actively use the language. ⁵In the Master's colloquium, candidates develop a concept for their final thesis.

(11) Key competencies are recommended, especially in the areas of methodological competence, social competence, and language competence, such as:

- a) Languages (strongly recommended for Latin and English, but also French, Russian and Greek or German if you choose English-language study options) for both future academics and students who want to work in international institutions;
- b) Further training in IT and basic knowledge of economics for the field of international financial cooperation, development aid and economic cooperation;
- c) Rhetorical and communication skills as well as the development of leadership and management qualities are useful in the fields of international cooperation, diplomatic and other policy-related services or in institutional work with foreigners;
- d) Media communication, Spokesperson and writing training are recommended for students who will be working in the media field.

(12) The module overview also describes the module packages "Arabic-Islamic Studies" with a total of 36 C or 18 C, the module packages "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World" with a total of 36 C or 18 C, and "Islamic law" with a total of 36 C, which can be included in another Master's degree programme.

§ 3 a Subject-specific types of examination

¹In addition to the types of examination provided for in the APO (General examination and programme rules and regulations for B.A. and M.A. programmes), examinations may take the form as follows: Portfolio. ²A portfolio ("document folder") serves to document one's own course of study and learning process in a reflective and commentary manner. Various shorter tasks are summarised in a portfolio (e.g. lesson logs and reading summaries).

§ 3 b Language of the study programme

¹The degree programme can be studied in German or English. ²The language of instruction in the courses is usually German or English. ³In addition, Arabic is also used as the language of instruction and practice. ⁴Examinations can be written in German or English, depending on the study option.

⁵Examinations of compulsory modules must be completed in the language of the chosen study option.

§ 4 Admission to the Master's thesis

As a prerequisite for admission to the Master's thesis Credits must be passed as follows:

- a. In the case of core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" (German-language study option) or "Arabic-Islamic Studies" (English-language study option) to the extent of 78 C compulsory, elective and optional modules of the Master's programme to the extent of 70 C,
- b. In the case of core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" (German-language study option) or "Arabic-Islamic Studies" (English-language study option) to the extent of 42 C, compulsory, elective and optional modules of the Master's programme to the extent of 70 C, of which at least 30 C must have been passed in the core subject studies "Arabic-Islamic Studies" or "Arabic-Islamic Studies".

§ 5 Retaking examinations to improve grades

It is not possible to retake passed examinations for the purpose of improving grades; the provision of § 16 a section 3 sentence 2 APO remains unaffected.

§ 6 Study as a module package

(1) ¹In the course of study "Arabic-Islamic Studies" as a module package with a total of 36 C (in German), three modules from the subject areas available for selection are completed in the course of the first three semesters. ²In each of these modules, 6 C are acquired through participation in source work and a presentation or through practical language performance. ³In the first year of study, in-depth knowledge of grammar and lexis as well as active command of the language are acquired in parallel. ⁴The acquisition of basic knowledge of another language of the Islamic cultural area (e.g. Turkish or Persian) or of the Semitic language family (e.g. Syriac, Biblical Hebrew or Modern Hebrew) through import modules totaling 12 C is mandatory.

(2) ¹In the course of study "Arabic-Islamic Studies" as a module package amounting to 18 C (in German), students acquire 6 C each in two modules through participation in source work and a presentation or through language practical achievements. ²They perfect their knowledge of grammar and lexis as well as their active command of the language in the exercises "Arabic for advanced learners" to the extent of 6 C.

(3) In the course of study "Islamic law" as a module package of 36 C (in German), students acquire in-depth knowledge of Islamic law, namely of its origins in its present-day state form, acquire the special legal language (language of international conventions, laws, ordinances, court decisions, etc.) and gain an insight into fundamental areas of legal studies through the connection with the Faculty of Law.

(4) ¹In the degree programme "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World" as a module package totalling 36 C (in English), three modules from the available subject areas are completed over the course of the first three semesters. ²In each of these modules, 6 C are earned through participation in source work and a presentation or through practical language skills in Arabic. ³In the first year of study, students acquire in-depth knowledge of grammar and lexis as well as an active command of the language. ⁴The acquisition of basic knowledge of another language of the Islamic cultural area (e.g. Turkish or Persian) or of the Semitic language family (e.g. Syriac and Aramaic, Biblical Hebrew or Modern Hebrew) through import modules totalling 12 C is recommended, but is not compulsory.

(5) In the course of study "Intellectual Histories of the Arab World" as a module package amounting to 18 C (in English), the students acquire 6 C each in two modules through participation in source work and a presentation or through practical language achievements oriented towards Arabic. They perfect their knowledge of grammar and lexis as well as their active command of the language in the exercises "Arabic for advanced learners" amounting to 6 C.

(6) ¹The language of instruction in the courses is usually German or English. ²In addition, Arabic is used as the language of instruction and practice.

§ 7 Comment on the courses

¹An annotated list of courses is prepared for each semester and is available towards the end of the previous semester. ²It contains more detailed information on the contents of courses that must be attended as part of a module. ³It provides literature references for preparation, gives information on compulsory reading as well as on the study obligations to be fulfilled in each case, and informs about the place and time of the course and the lecturers involved. ⁴In addition, it contains important information and notes for the implementation of the study programme, such as registration and examination modalities and dates, office hours of the lecturers; opening hours of the secretary's office and library, etc.

§ 8 Student Counselling; Obligatory Student Counselling

(1) The specialised study advisory service is offered by the lecturers involved in the degree programme, while advice on examination matters is provided by the Examination Office of the Faculty of Humanities.

(2) The Central Student Advisory Office of the university is in charge of general study advice, especially regarding inter-faculty questions.

(3) In addition, students should take advantage of the study advisory service especially in the following cases:

- after failing an examination twice,
- in the event of any deviations from the standard course length,
- if changing the module package, study focus, degree programme or university,
- before a planned course of studies abroad,
- at the end of the second semester or at the beginning of the third semester of studies.

(4) ¹The choice of an English-language study option or enrollment in an English-language study focus according to § 3 section 6 requires the participation in a compulsory study counseling. ²This consultation must take place at the latest before registration for the first examination.

§ 9 Entry into force; transitional provisions

(1) These regulations shall enter into force retroactively on 01.10.2015 following their publication in the Official Announcements I of the Georg-August Universität of Göttingen.

(2) At the same time, the Examination regulations for the Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies" in the version of the announcement of 18.09.2009 (Official Announcements I No. 28/2009 p. 2784) as well as the Study Regulations for the Master's degree programme "Arabic-Islamic Studies" in the version of the announcement of 18.09.2009 (Official Announcements I No. 28/2009 p. 2791) shall expire.

(3)¹ Students who began their studies before an amendment to these Examination and Study Regulations came into force and who were continuously enrolled in this degree programme or continuously admitted to the module package „Arabic-Islamic Studies“ or "Islamic law" shall be examined according to the version applicable before this amendment came into force.² In the case of examinations still to be taken, this does not apply to module directory and lists, unless the protection of a student's legal entitlements requires a deviating decision by the examination committee.³ A deviating decision is possible in particular in cases in which an examination or a partial examination requirement can be repeated or a compulsory or required compulsory elective module has been substantially changed or cancelled.⁴ The examination committee may make general regulations in this regard.⁵ Upon application, students, according to sentence 1, shall be examined in total according to the provisions of the amended regulations.⁵ Examinations according to these regulations in the version valid prior to the entry into force of an amendment shall be taken for the last time in the fourth semester after the entry into force of this amendment.
