The Göttingen Centre for Gender Studies, in co-operation with the graduate School for Liberal Studies (GSGC) and the Göttingen Graduate School for Social Sciences (GGC), has been running the *Gender Lab* since the Winter Semester 2015/16, in which Bachelor and Master's students, doctoral candidates and Post-Docs have the opportunity to present their projects.

The idea behind the *Gender Lab* is to give added publicity to Gender Studies in Göttingen and to offer other students and relative newcomers the chance to discuss their work in a helpful context and to set up networks.

Our hope is that our Call for Papers (Note Deadline: 22 February 2019) will attract students attached to Göttingen University, and who are working in the field of Gender Studies, to join us for the coming Summer Semester. We see the *Gender Lab* also as an open forum for new methods of presentation and for discussion of various theoretical perspectives and working procedures in the field.

In the Summer Semester 2019 the *Gender Lab* will be held in the 'Hafenzimmer' (Salon for Art and Culture)!

Invitees can decide on their own mode of presentation. If needed, commentators and /or interlocutors can be found with the assistance of the *Gender Lab* team.

Informal applications including your name, course or field of studies, title of your paper (if possible with descriptive sub-title) and a short abstract (max. 400 words) should be submitted please by 22 February 2019 to both (!) email addresses of the organizers:
