Ian Cambell is Professor Emeritus of Scottish and Victorian Literature and Professorial Fellow at Edinburgh University. He is a specialist in 19th and 20th century English and Scottish literature and co-editor of the Duke-Edinburgh edition of the Carlyle Letters. He has written extensively on Carlyle, on Victorian literature and on Scottish literature since Burns.
