Eckart Frahm (PhD Göttingen 1996, Habilitation Heidelberg 2007) is Professor of Assyriology at Yale. His primary scholarly interest is the political and intellectual history of Assyria and Babylonia during the first millennium BCE. Frahm is the author of five books: Einleitung in die Sanherib-Inschriften (Vienna 1997); Historische und historisch-literarische Texte aus Assur (Wiesbaden 2009); Neo-Babylonian Letters and Contracts from the Eanna Archive (New Haven 2011, co-authored with Michael Jursa); Babylonian and Assyrian Text Commentaries: Origins of Interpretation (Münster 2011); and Geschichte des alten Mesopotamien (Ditzingen 2013). He is currently working on a Companion to Assyria for Wiley-Blackwell and, together with Enrique Jiménez, on a project to publish a large number of Mesopotamian commentaries both in book form and online.
