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Faculty of Biology and Psychology:

Following the resolutions of the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Biology and Psychology dated 23.06.2021 and the Senate of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen dated 24.08.2021, the Foundation's University Committee of the University of Göttingen Public Law Foundation approved the regulation concerning the qualifications for entry and admission for the consecutive Master's degree programme "Computational Biology and Bioinformatics" on 01.12.2021 (§ 44 section 1 sentence 2 NHG in the version of the announcement of 26.02.2007 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 69), last amended by Article 14 of the Act on 16.12.2021 (Nds. GVBI. Regulation concerning the qualifications for entry and admission for the consecutive Master's degree programme "Computational Biology and Bioinformatics"

I. Scope

§ 1 Scope

(1) These regulations stipulate the entry and admission to the consecutive Master's degree programme "Computational Biology and Bioinformatics".

(2) The university executes an autonomous procedure for determining the entry qualifications for all university places to be filled up in the consecutive Master's degree programme "Computational Biology and Bioinformatics" in accordance with the following provisions.

(3) ¹If the number of applicants, who meet the qualifications for entry, exceeds the available places, the university awards the places according to the selection procedure proper to higher education. ²If the number of applicants who meet the qualifications for entry falls short of the available places, a selection procedure does not take place.

II. Authorisation for entry

§ 2 Admission requirements

(1) ¹Prerequisite for entry to the Master's degree programme is that the applicant has the professional aptitude. ²The professional aptitude is possessed by those who have completed a relevant Bachelor's degree with a standard period of study of at least six semesters and a scope of at least 180 ECTS credits or with an equivalent degree in a degree programme at a German higher education institution or at a higher education institution belonging to one of the Bologna signatory states in accordance with section 3 in the degree programme biology, bioinformatics, computer science or in a closely related subject area. ³The degree examinations, which are equivalent to the qualifications under sentence 1 and have been passed in a country other than the Bologna Signatory States, require the assessment of equivalence in consideration of the proposals by the Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB) at the office of the permanent conference of the federal ministers of education in the Federal Republic of Germany (KMK) for the accreditation and assessment of foreign proof of academic qualification should be converted to the German grading system.

(2) ¹Notwithstanding section 1, entry is generally guaranteed to persons who have not yet completed a programme at the time of application, but have acquired at least 150 credits in a relevant Bachelor's degree programme according to section 3 or an equivalent degree programme. ²The average grade calculated from the previous academic achievements is also considered in the selection procedure instead of the bachelor grade or the grade of an equivalent proof of academic qualification, irrespective of whether the result of the bachelor's examination deviates therefrom.

(3) ¹The decision whether an undergraduate degree is appropriate (relevance of previous studies) in the sense of sections 1 and 2 is made by the selection committee. ²Requirement for appropriateness of the undergraduate degree is the proof of:

a) at least 50 credits from the fields of biology and bioinformatics and at least 40 credits from the fields of mathematics, statistics, computer science, bioinformatics and physics or

b) at least 30 credits from the fields of biology and bioinformatics and at least 60 credits from the fields of mathematics, statistics, computer science or bioinformatics.

³Insofar as fewer persons apply who satisfy all qualifications for entry according to sentence 2 than there are university places to be awarded, the selection committee may require the completion of pending academic achievements under sentence 2 within two semesters for assessing the relevance of previous studies; in this case, assessment of appropriateness and admission is subject to termination until proof of the pending academic achievements, which should be submitted within two semesters from the time of enrolment at the university (final deadline). ⁴If the proof of the pending academic achievements is not submitted within the deadline, the assessment of the appropriateness of previous studies and a related letter of admission will become ineffective. ⁵The assessment of the appropriateness is omitted if the components under sentences 2 and 3 that have not been accomplished yet have a rating of more than 15 credits.

(4) In deviation from section 3, foreign nationals and stateless persons with a recognized prior education certificate who are neither equivalent to Germans according to legal regulations nor nationals of another member state of the European Union or another state party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area nor have acquired their Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree at a German higher education institution or at a higher education institution of another member state of the European Union or another state party to the Agreement on the European Union or another state party to the Agreement on the European Union or another state party to the Agreement on the European Union or another state party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area, additionally prove the relevance of their previous studies by successfully passing an aptitude test in accordance with § 3.

(5) ¹Applicants whose native language is not English must show very good English language skills. ²Very good knowledge of English must be demonstrated with standardised or accredited certificates at least at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages of the Council of Europe (CEFR). ³The following in particular shall serve as proof:

- a) UNIcert®: min. certificate UNIcert® III;
- b) NULTE certificate: min. level C1;
- c) Cambridge English Scale: min. 180 points;
- d) International English Language Testing System (IELTS Academic): min. band 6.5;
- e) Test of English as a Foreign Language, internet-based test (TOEFL iBT): min. 95 points;
- f) Global Scale of English (Pearson Academic): min. 76 points;
- g) further accredited or standardised certificates can also be recognised after establishment of equivalence.

⁴Successful completion of the test (a-f) may, as a rule, be no longer than two years before submission of the application for admission to the master degree programme. ⁵At least two years of residence in an English-speaking country for the purpose of study or work within three years prior to submission of the application for admission, or successful degree earned in a degree programme in the English language lasting at least two years, also constitute proof of very good English language proficiency.

(6) ¹Notwithstanding, the general provisions of the enrolment regulation of the University of Göttingen for enrolment remain unaffected. ²Enrolment by applicants,

a) who according to section 2 are considered eligible for admission is subject to the proof of successful completion of the Bachelor's degree programme or an equivalent academic programme.

b) who have not proven the language skills required according to section 5 before enrolment is resolutive conditional upon proof of the same.

³Proof must be submitted by 15/11 during enrolment for the winter semester. ⁴Provided the Dean of Studies of the Faculty of Biology and Psychology determines, on the basis of the periods of studies so far, in particular the present examination components, that the applicant pursuant to sentence 2 letter a) will attain the degree at the latest by the end of the first semester of the Master's degree programme, the deadline in accordance with sentence 3 shall be extended to the end of 31/03 for enrolment for a winter semester; this determination is only admissible provided

a) only the thesis is missing as an examination achievement or

b) the thesis has already been submitted to the university and the amount of the examination components that are still missing does not exceed six credits.

§ 3 Aptitude test

(1) ¹The aptitude test is intended to show the extent to which the applicant, against the background of previous study experience, has completed a relevant previous course of study and is suitable for study in the consecutive Master's degree programme "Computational Biology and Bioinformatics". ²The examination covers knowledge and skills in the fields of molecular biology, computer science and mathematics.

(2) ¹In order to participate in the aptitude test, the applicant must register via an online portal provided by the university. ²After registration, applicants receive an individual access code.

(3) The following principles shall apply to the conduct of the aptitude test:

- a) The test is offered via the learning platform "OpenILIAS" of the University of Göttingen and can be taken by registered applicants at any time in the period from 01/04 to 15/05, but only once per applicant; the individual access code is used up with the start of the processing.
- b) The aptitude test is conducted in English.
- c) The aptitude test is conducted as a multiple-choice or multiple-select test. For the electronically presented multiple-choice or multiple-select tasks (MC tasks), the applicant must indicate which of the answers presented with the MC tasks he or she considers to be correct or incorrect. At least four answers must be given in an MC task.
- d) An applicant who fails to take the aptitude test within the period specified in letter a) without good cause shall be excluded from the further procedure. An excluded applicant is entitled to participate again in the next possible aptitude test.

(4) ¹The yardstick for the degree of suitability is the total number of MC tasks answered correctly or the total number of points achieved. ²Satisfactory performance is deemed to have been achieved if the applicant has answered at least 60 percent of the MC tasks correctly or has achieved at least 60 percent of the points or if the number of MC tasks answered correctly by the applicant or the number of points achieved by the applicant is not more than 10 percent below the average performance of the participants. ³The applicant shall be notified of the result of the aptitude test in text form.

III. Selection procedure

§ 4 Start of programme, application for admission, closing date

(1) ¹The Master's degree programme starts every winter semester. ²The application for admission should be submitted at first via an online portal; it must be received by the university together with the application documents required according to section 2 by 15/05 (cut-off deadline) for the winter semester. ³The application applies only to the award of university places on the relevant admission date. ⁴The university is not obligated to review the details of the applicants as part of its required duties.

(2) The application for admission must be accompanied by the following documents, which must be uploaded to the university's server using the online portal:

- a. The degree certificate(s) of the applicant in the form of attested copies or certified German or English translations, if the originals are not in English or German; if a degree certificate is not yet submitted, a certificate of the acquired academic achievements, the credits and the average grade should be submitted;
- b. A tabular curriculum vitae written in German or English with a convincing description of the educational career;
- c. a proof of sufficient knowledge of the English language according to § 2 section 5;
- d. if applicable, the result of the aptitude test according to § 3;
- e. A declaration on whether the applicant has successfully / unsuccessfully completed a Master's Programme in the same discipline or has not completed it yet;
- f. a presentation written in German or English, from which the applicant's motivation for taking up this course of study can be seen;
- g. If applicable, evidence of specific knowledge which is conducive to the successful completion of this degree programme, taking into account the desired specialisation;
- h. A declaration on the specialisation the applicant intends to complete based on his or her previous education.

(3) ¹Applications that are not submitted complete, or in due form and time, shall be excluded from the further procedure. ²The documents submitted remain with the university.

(4) If an applicant can credibly demonstrate that he or she is disadvantaged by the selection procedure compared to other applicants due to a disability, he or she shall be granted upon application a suitable compensation for disadvantages.

§ 5 Selection Committee for the Master's degree programme

(1) To prepare for the selection procedure, the Faculty of Biology and Psychology at the university shall form at least one selection committee for this degree programme.

(2) ¹A selection committee includes three members eligible to vote, who belong to the scientific personnel working full-time or the professoral group, and a students' representative with advisory vote. ²At least one member must belong to the professoral group. ³The members are appointed by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Biology and Psychology. ⁴The tenure of the members is two years, while that of the students' representative is one year. ⁵Reappointment is possible. ⁶The selection committee holds a quorum if at least two members eligible to vote are present.

(3) The tasks of the selection committee are:

- a) Review of the incoming applications of admission for formal correctness,
- b) Review and assessment of the admission qualifications, if necessary,
- c) Conducting the interviews in accordance with § 9,
- d) Decision on the admission or rejection of the applicant.

(4) The selection committee reports to the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Biology and Psychology on the experience gathered and submits any suggestions for further development of the award procedure, after conclusion of the award procedure.

§ 6 Sequence of the selection procedure

(1) A selection procedure includes the award of university places related to the specific admission date.

(2) ¹The applications for admission are decided in a main procedure and in the procedure for subsequent admissions, if required. ²In the first step of the main procedure, the university places will be awarded at first to the applicants entitled to admission with outstanding suitability (best quota; § 7) and then to the applicants entitled to admission according to combination of further criteria (combination quota; § 8).

(3) ¹Anyone who has been awarded admission in the best quota will not participate in the combination quota of the selection procedure. ²Anyone who has been awarded admission in the best quota or the combination quota will not participate in a procedure for subsequent admissions.

(4) The selection committee can provide for the likely event that some university places may not be accepted by overbooking. (5) The remaining university places from the best quota are included in the combination quota.

(6) ¹Notwithstanding, the general provisions of the enrolment regulation of the university for enrolment remain unaffected. ²Admission by applicants,

- a) who according to § 2 section 2 are considered provisionally entitled to admission is subject to a condition subsequent until the proof of successful completion of the Bachelor's degree programme or an equivalent academic programme is provided.
- b) who have not proven the language skills required according to § 2 section 5 before enrolment is conditional upon proof of the same.

³Proof must be submitted by 15/11 during enrolment for the winter semester. ⁴Provided the Dean of Studies of the Faculty of Biology and Psychology determines, on the basis of the periods of studies so far, in particular the present examination components, that the applicant pursuant to sentence 2 letter a) will attain the degree at the latest by the end of the first semester of the Master's degree programme, the deadline in accordance with sentence 3 shall be extended to the end of 31/03 for enrolment for a winter semester; this determination is only admissible provided

a) only the thesis is missing as an examination achievement or

b) the thesis has already been submitted to the university and the amount of the examination components that are still missing does not exceed six credits.

§ 7 Best quota

(1) ¹For selection as part of the best quota, a ranking list is generated according to the following provisions. ²50% of the study places are awarded according to the ranking list, beginning with place 1. ³In case of identical ranking, the ranking is determined according to the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. Apart from this, a draw will decide the outcome in case of identical ranking.

(2) ¹The selection is made on the basis of a ranking in which a maximum of 90 points can be achieved. ²This is prepared in accordance with the following provisions:

a) according to the result of the bachelor grade or the grade of an equivalent degree, points are awarded to the applicant as follows:

1.0 up to and including 1.2	51 points,
over 1.2 up to and including 1.5	48 points,
over 1.5 up to and including 1.8	45 points,
over 1.8 up to and including 2.1	42 points,
over 2.1 up to and including 2.4	39 points,
over 2.4 up to and including 2.7	36 points,
over 2.7 up to and including 3.0	30 points,
over 3.0 up to and including 3.3	24 points,

over 3.3 up to and including 3.6	18 points,
over 3.6 up to and including 3.9	12 points,
over 4.0 up to and including 4.0	0 points.

b) for specialised knowledge that is required for successful completion of this degree programme in consideration of the pursued field of specialisation, the applicant will be awarded a maximum of 39 points as follows:

ba) no more than 24 points for proof submitted of examination components in the following fields, based on the credit points proven in each respective area:

- Computer Science,
- Systems biology/bioinformatics,
- Ecoinformatics/Breeding Informatics,
- Molecular Biology/Cell Biology,
- Biochemistry/Genetics,
- Evolutionary Biology/Developmental Biology,
- Breeding Biology,
- Farm animal research/ crop research.

c) The points attained under points a) and b) are added.

(3) ¹Applicants who are admitted as part of the best quota receive a letter of admission from the university in a text form. ²This letter specifies the deadline, within which the applicant should enrol or declare in writing whether he or she will accept the university place. ³The applicant must enrol at the latest two weeks after expiry of the deadline mentioned in sentence 2 (closing date), provided no enrolment according to sentence 2 has been made. ⁴If the university does not have

a) the enrolment under sentence 2 or

b) the declaration under sentence 2 and the enrolment under sentence 3 within the specified deadline and in the correct form, the letter of admission will become ineffective. ⁵These legal consequences must be pointed out in the letter of admission.

(4) The students who are admitted no longer take part in any further procedure.

§ 8 Combination quota

(1) ¹For the selection as part of the combination quota, a ranking list is generated in accordance with the following provisions. ²50% of the university places are awarded according to the ranking list, beginning with place 1.

(2) The selection is made on the basis of a combination of the following criteria:

- a) On the basis of the Bachelor's grade or the grade of an equivalent educational certificate as well as special knowledge that is conducive to the successful completion of this degree programme, in accordance with the ranking list pursuant to § 7 section 2 and
- b) According to the result of an interview with the applicant.

(3) The selection committee screens the received applications according to section 4 and selects from the screened applicants on the basis of the admission criteria mentioned in sections 2 and 5.

(4) ¹The received applications are screened as a preselection to two times the number of university places to be awarded as per the selection procedure in order to limit the number of participants for the interview. ²These should also include the applications from persons who have already participated in an earlie interview under § 9 section 5. ³For this purpose, the

ranking list pursuant to § 7 section 2 shall be taken as a basis. ⁴In the event of an identical ranking, all applicants in the highest ranking will be permitted to participate.

(5) ¹The selection is made on the basis of a ranking list, in which a maximum of 100 points is attainable. ²This is generated in accordance with the following provisions:

a) According to the assessment of the degree of eligibility in the interview, points are awarded to the applicant as follows:

The applicant is:

very suitable	08 - 10 points
suitable	04 - 07 points
less suitable	01 - 03 points
barely suitable	0 points.

b) The applicant will be credited with the points acquired in accordance with § 7 section2.

c) The points attained under points a) and b) are added.

(6) ¹If there is identical ranking after generating the ranking list, the ranking sequence is determined based on the results of determination pursuant to § 7 section 2, thereupon according to the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. ²A draw shall be held to decide the outcome in all other cases in which there is identical ranking.

(7) The selected applicants are admitted under § 10.

§ 9 Interview

(1) ¹The interview is intended to determine whether the applicant is suitable for the selected degree programme. ²The following principles apply to the execution of the interview:

- a) In general, the interview is carried out by 30/06 at the university. The exact dates as well as the place are announced within an appropriate period before start of the interviews by the university. The university invites the candidates to the interview with sufficient notice. A video conference or a telephone interview is permitted for overseas applicants as well as in established exceptions, as far as the identity of the applicant can be determined beyond doubt. The selection committee determines the details of the procedure in such cases.
- b) The selection committee conducts an interview lasting about 15 minutes with every applicant. The interview can be held simultaneously for up to four applicants.
- c) Minutes are kept of the essential questions and answers within the interview; said minutes must be signed by the members of the selection committee. The minutes should clearly show the day and place of the interview, the names of the committee members, the name of the applicant and the assessment.

(2) The interview extends to the motivation of the applicant as well as the following suitability parameters:

- a) subject-related background,
- b) programme-related professional and personal goals,
- c) previous experience and knowledge in the field of the pursued specialisation,
- d) knowledge of the German language/scientific language,
- e) clear idea of the study contents of this degree programme,

(3) The members of the selection committee assess the applicant after conclusion of the interview to ascertain suitability for the selected degree programme on a scale according to § 7 section 5 sentence 2 letter a).

(4) ¹An applicant who fails to appear at the interview without good cause shall be excluded from the further procedure. ²If there is an important reason, the selection committee shall set a new date for the selection interview upon application. ³The important reason and the application for a new date must be proven or submitted to the selection committee without delay, but at the latest within two days of the date initially set. ⁴An excluded applicant shall be entitled to participate again in the next possible selection procedure.

(5) ¹An early interview may be conducted with students of the university who are enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme that is specialised by this Master's degree programme, as part of the undergraduate degree programme. ²The early interview replaces the interview for the case that the student has applied for this Master's degree programme. ³The interview may be conducted at the earliest by the start of the fifth subject semester. ⁴This early interview must be equivalent to the standard interview in terms of form and content. ⁵The provisions laid down in sections 1 to 4, of § 8 section 5 sentence 2 letter a) and § 4 sections 2 to 4 apply accordingly. ⁶The early interview is considered in place of the standard interview only if it was not conducted earlier than six months before the closing date and the applicant belongs to the persons preselected for a selection interview in accordance with the provisions under § 8 section 4. ⁷Insofar as this condition does not exist, the applicant is excluded from further selection procedure in the combination quota of this application procedure. ⁸A notification about the result of the early interview is made only under the prerequisite that the applicant has been pre-selected for an interview under § 8 section 4.

§ 10 Letter of admission, rejection letter and procedure for subsequent admissions

(1) ¹Applicants who can be admitted as part of the combination quota receive a letter of admission from the university in a text form. ²This letter specifies the deadline, within which the applicant should enrol or declare in writing whether he or she will accept the university place. ³The applicant must enrol at the latest two weeks after expiry of the deadline mentioned in sentence 2 (closing date), provided no enrolment according to sentence 2 has been made. ⁴If

a) the enrolment under sentence 2 or

b) the declaration under sentence 2 and the enrolment under sentence 3

are not submitted to the university within the specified deadline and in the correct form, the letter of admission will become ineffective. ⁵These legal consequences must be pointed out in the letter of admission.

(2) ¹Applicants who are not entitled to admission receive a rejection letter in text form, in which the attained ranking and the ranking of the applicant last admitted are listed. ²The rejection letter provides information on rights of legal recourse. ³In the case of applicants entitled to admission, it also includes the request to declare within a specified period of time, at least in text form, whether the admissions application will be submitted for a procedure for subsequent admissions. ⁴If the applicant does not submit this declaration within a specified period or in the correct form, he or she will be excluded from the procedure for subsequent admissions. ⁵Reference must be made to this legal consequence.

(3) ¹The procedure for subsequent admissions will be executed on the basis of the ranking list according to § 8 sections 5 and 6. ²If the ranking according to sentence 1 is exhausted, the ranking according to § 7 section 2 is used as a basis and the procedure for subsequent admissions is carried out on the basis of this ranking. ³In the case of identical ranking after the generation of a ranking list, the ranking order is determined according to the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. ⁴A lottery shall in all cases thereafter decide the outcome in the event of identical ranking. ⁵The provisions of the section 1 apply correspondingly.

(4) ¹The admission procedures are completed at the latest by 15/11. ²University places that are still remaining will be awarded through a draw by application without formal requirements. ³The application period for this starts two weeks before commencement of the semester, for which the admission should be made, and ends with conclusion of the procedure. ⁴The award of university places through a draw is completed at the latest on 30/11 of a year because of the advanced lecture period.

§ 11 Admission to higher semesters

(1) The free university places in a higher semester with limited admission are awarded to applicants in the following sequence,

a) Who are in the same or a similar degree programme,

aa) are or were enrolled at a different German university or at a university domiciled in another member state of the European Union or in another signatory state to the Agreement on the European Economic Area, ab) Who are or were enrolled at a foreign university and possess the German nationality or are subject to the same university admissions laws and regulations as German citizens,

b) For whom the rejection of admission for personal reasons would mean extraordinary hardship,

c) Who assert other reasons.

(2) Within each one of the three case groups of the section 1, the result of the bachelor's examination or an examination equivalent to the bachelor's examination, thereupon the social, especially family-related and economic reasons that are decisive for the choice of place, and finally the draw in cases that are still identical.

§ 12 Quota system

(1) ¹A special quota of 20 per cent of the number of admissions to this degree programme shall be allocated for the admission of foreign nationals and stateless persons with a recognised certificate of previous education who are neither equivalent to Germans under legal provisions nor nationals of another Member State of the European Union or of another State party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area nor have obtained their Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree at a German higher education institution or at a higher education institution of another Member State of the European Union or of another State party to the Agreement on the European Linion or of another State party to the Agreement on the European Agreement Union or of another State party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area. ²Applications of foreign nationals and stateless persons within the meaning of sentence 1 shall not be considered in the selection procedure pursuant to § 6.

(2) ¹The selection shall be made in accordance with the provisions of §§ 1 to 9, unless otherwise regulated in the following:

a) A best-ratio according to § 7 is not formed.

b) In ranking, points shall not be awarded for special knowledge, skills and experience in accordance with § 7 section 2 sentence 2 letter b).

c) In ranking, points will be credited to the applicant depending on the result of the aptitude test according to § 3 as follows:

If the applicant has correctly answered MC questions or achieved points in the following number in excess of the number required for passing according to § 3 section 4 sentence 2, points will be credited to him or her as follows:

at least 85 %	29 points;
at least 77 %	26 points;
at least 69 %	23 points;
at least 61 %	20 points;
at least 53 %	17 points;

at least 45 %	14 points;
at least 37 %	11 points;
at least 29 %	8 points;
at least 21 %	5 points;
at least 13 %	2 points;
under 13 %	0 points.

d) Depending on the determination of the degree of suitability in the selection interview, the applicant will be credited with points as follows:

The applicant is:very suitable16 to 20 points,suitable08 to 14 points,less suitable01 to 07 points,barely suitable0 points.

e) The selection committee may take into account special circumstances that speak in favor of studying at a German university by awarding a total of up to 9 additional points. Such a circumstance shall be deemed to exist in particular if the applicant

ba) proves that he/she has been awarded a scholarship by a publicly funded institution,

- bb) has successfully attended a college at the suggestion of a Lower Saxony institution
- of higher education and is registered for a place at university,
- bc) belongs to a developing country,
- bd) enjoys the right of asylum in the Federal Republic of Germany,
- be) belongs to a German-speaking minority abroad or is subject to funding by intergovernmental treaties or higher education agreements.

(3) Any study places remaining available under this quota shall be added to the quota for the selection procedure pursuant to § 6.

§ 13 Entry into force
