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## Faculty of Economic Sciences:

Following the resolution of the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Economic Sciences dated 07.02.2024, the Senate of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen approved the seventh amendment of the regulations concerning the gualifications for entry and admission to the Master's degree programme "Applied Statistics" in the version published on 28.03.2013 (Official Announcements I no. 14/2013 p. 341), last amended by statutes dated 27.09.2023 (Official Announcements I no. 28/2023 p. 1038); the amendments are deemed to have been approved on the basis of a resolution of the Foundation Committee University of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen, Foundation under Public Law of 10.07.2019 (§ 44 section 1 sentence 2 NHG in the version of the announcement dated 26.02.2007 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 69), last amended by Article 12 of the Act dated 14.12.2023 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 320); § 41 section 1 sentence 1 NHG in conjunction with § 18 section 6 sentence 3, section 8, sentence 4 NHG and § 7 section 1 sentence 1 NHZG in the version of the announcement dated 29.01.1998 (Nds. GVBI. (Lower Saxony Law and Official Gazette) p. 51), last amended by Article 2 of the Act dated 19.11.2019 (Nds. GVBI. # Regulation concerning the qualifications for entry and admission for the consecutive Master's degree programme "Applied Statistics" at the University of Göttingen

## I. Scope § 1 Scope

(1) These regulations stipulate the entry and admission to the consecutive Master's degree programme "Applied Statistics".

(2) The University carries out an autonomous procedure for assessing the entry qualifications for all university places to be awarded in the consecutive Master's degree programme "Applied Statistics" in accordance with the following provisions.

(3) <sup>1</sup>If the number of applicants who meet the qualifications for entry exceeds the available university places, the University shall award the places based on the results of its own selection procedure. <sup>2</sup>If the number of applicants who meet the qualifications for entry falls short of the available places, no selection procedure shall take place.

#### II. Authorisation for admission

#### § 2 Qualifications for entry

(1) <sup>1</sup>It is a requirement for entrance to the Master's degree programme that the applicant possesses the professional competence. <sup>2</sup>Candidates are considered to have technical aptitude if they have completed a six semester course of studies with bachelor degree in a relevant subject with a scope of at least 180 ECTS credits, or an equivalent degree in a degree programme at a German university or a university domiciled in one of the Bologna signatory states, as per section 3 in the degree programme Statistics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Economics, Agricultural Economics or in a technically related subject area. <sup>3</sup>Degree examinations that are considered equivalent to the qualifications under sentence 2 and have been passed in a country other than the Bologna Signatory States require the assessment of equivalence in consideration of the proposals by the Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB) at the office of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs of the Länder in the Federal Republic of Germany (KMK) for the accreditation and assessment of foreign proof of academic qualification that are laid down at the URL www.anabin.de. <sup>4</sup>The grades of the foreign certificates of academic qualification must be converted to the German grading system.

(2) <sup>1</sup>Notwithstanding section 1, authorisation for admission will be in principle considered proven by applicants who have not yet completed a course of studies at the time of application, but have acquired at least 150 credits in a relevant Bachelor's degree programme as stated in section 3 or in an equivalent degree programme. <sup>2</sup>The average grade calculated from the previous examination components is also taken into consideration in the selection procedure in place of the Bachelor grade or the grade of an equivalent certificate of academic qualification, irrespective of whether the result of the Bachelor's examination deviates from this.

(3) <sup>1</sup>The decision as to whether a preliminary course of studies is relevant within the meaning of sections 1 to 2 shall be made by the selection committee. <sup>2</sup>Requirement for subject relevance of the undergraduate degree is the proof of at least the following components:

components with a rating of at least 60 credits from the areas of Statistics, Mathematics, Computer Science or other quantitative areas, of which at least 24 credits are to be in the area of Statistics, including at least 12 credits from modules with an average or high academic standard.

<sup>3</sup>Subject relevance is assessed on the basis of the documents to be submitted along with the application as well as suitable criteria, such as the teaching contents, the used literature, the module prerequisites, the study and examination regulations and the schedule of the degree programme, in which the component was accomplished. <sup>4</sup>The selection committee may require the completion of pending examination components under sentence 2 within two semesters for assessing the subject relevance; in this case, assessment of subject relevance and the entry is subject to termination until proof of the pending examination components, which should be submitted within two semesters from the time of enrolment at the University (final deadline). <sup>5</sup>If proof of the pending examination components is not submitted by the deadline, the assessment of the relevance of the subject and any letter of admission based on this shall become ineffective. <sup>6</sup>Assessment of the relevance of the subject shall not be possible if the components in accordance with sentence 2 that have not yet been performed have a rating of more than 15 credits.

(4) <sup>1</sup>Applicants, who neither meet a German university entry requirement nor have acquired their Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree at a German university, must show sufficient proficiency in the German language. <sup>2</sup>Proof hereof is demonstrated by means of a test with the grade point average DSH-2 in accordance with the examination regulation for the German language test for university admission of foreign prospective students (DSH). <sup>3</sup>The obligation to take the test need not be met by applicants, who are exempted from the German language test for admission to colleges and universities according to the examination regulations for the German language test for the admission of foreign students to colleges and universities (DSH) at the University of Göttingen this applies especially to those applicants, who have proven the required German language skill through the "Test of German as a Foreign Language" (TestDaF) with at least four-times TestDaF grade level 4 (TDN 4) or the "German examination module" of the assessment test during the preparatory course.

(5) <sup>1</sup>Applicants whose native language is not English must show good English language skills. <sup>2</sup>Good English language skills must be demonstrated with standardised or accredited certificates at minimum B2 level in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) or comparable achievements; the following shall serve as proof:

a) a proof of academic achievement for at least one Business English course at level
B2 from an accredited university;

b) Cambridge English Scale: min. 160 points;

c) International English Language Testing System (IELTS Academic): min. band 5.5;

d) Test of English as a Foreign Language, internet-based test (TOEFL iBT): min. 80 points;

e) Global Scale of English (Pearson Academic): min. 59 points;

f) UNIcert®: min. certificate UNIcert® III;

g) NULTE certificate: min. level B2: Acert (Poland), CertACLES (Spain), CLES (France), UNIcert®LUCE (Czech Republic and Slovakia), UNI-LANG (United Kingdom). \*Network of University Language Testers in Europe

<sup>3</sup>Other certificates according to the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages" (CEFR) can be admitted by the selection committee after a professional statement by the Central Institution for Languages and Key Qualifications (ZESS) of the University of Göttingen.

<sup>4</sup>Successful completion of the tests may not be more than three years before submission of the application for admission to the Master's degree programme. <sup>5</sup>Exempt from the obligation to provide proof of a test are applicants who can provide evidence of

a) one year spent studying at school / university or working abroad in an Englishspeaking country, not earlier than five years before submission of the application for admission,

b) the successful completion of a degree programme taught entirely in English or

c) education that was acquired at a school with English as the medium of instruction and is equivalent to the German university entrance qualification.

d) an average grade of at least 8 points in the subject "English" within the two school years prior to obtaining the university entrance qualification.

<sup>6</sup>The proof of very good English language skills must be furnished by the applicant to the Faculty of Economic Sciences by 15 November for enrolment for a winter semester; the enrolment is conditional until proof is received.

(6) <sup>1</sup>In all other respects, the general provisions of the regulation applying to enrolment at the University of Göttingen remain unaffected. <sup>2</sup>The enrolment of the applicants authorised in principle for admission according to sentence 2 is subject to termination until proof of successful completion of the Bachelor's degree programme or an equivalent course of studies. <sup>3</sup>When enrolling for the winter semester, proof must be submitted by the end of 15 November <sup>4</sup>If the Dean of Studies confirms, on the basis of the periods of studies at present, in particular, the examination components at present, that the applicant will obtain the degree at the latest by the end of the first semester of the Master's course of study, the period according to sentence 3 will be extended upon enrolment for a winter semester until the end of 31 March; the confirmation is permitted only if

a) as examination results, only the thesis is missing or

b) the thesis has already been submitted to the university and the amount of the examination components that are still missing does not exceed six credits.

## **III. Selection procedure**

#### § 3 Start of programme, application for admission, closing date

(1) <sup>1</sup>The Master's degree programme starts with the winter semester. <sup>2</sup>The admissions application should be submitted via an online portal; more details will be announced by the university within an appropriate time frame before expiry of the closing date for applications. <sup>3</sup>The application for admission for the Master's degree programme must have been submitted to the university using the forms provided at the online portal, along with the application documents required in accordance with section 2 by 15 May (closing date) for the winter semester. <sup>4</sup>The application applies only to the award of university places for the relevant admission date. <sup>5</sup>The university is not obliged to review the details of the applicants ex officio.

- (2) The following documents should be enclosed with the application for admission:
- a) the degree certificate/s of the applicant in German or English; if a degree certificate is not yet present, a certificate (with verification code or attestation of the issuing institution) regarding the acquired examination components, the credits and the average grade should be submitted;
- b) a curriculum vitae in tabular form written in German or English with a meaningful presentation of the educational background;
- c) proof of sufficient knowledge of the German language, if neither a German higher education entrance qualification nor a Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree from a German higher education institution in a German-language degree programme is proven;
- d) if necessary, proof of very good English language proficiency according to § 2 section 5;
- e) a declaration as to whether the applicant has successfully / unsuccessfully completed a Master's degree programme in a similar discipline or has not yet completed it;
- f) an account in German or English which shows the motivation of the applicant for accepting this degree programme;
- g) transcripts from the Module Handbook or other documents, based on which the credits can be reviewed in accordance with § 2 section 3.

<sup>2</sup>Documents in accordance with letters a) and d) must be submitted upon request of the university in the original or as certified copies in German or English.

(3) <sup>1</sup>Applications that are not submitted in full, or in due form and time, shall be excluded from the further procedure. <sup>2</sup>The documents submitted shall be retained by the University.

(4) If a prospective student credibly demonstrates that they are disadvantaged compared to other applicants due to an obstacle in the selection procedure, appropriate compensation for disadvantage is to be granted by the Selection Committee upon application.

## § 4 Selection committee for the Master's degree programme

(1) For processing the selection decision, the Faculty of Economic Sciences and the Faculty of Medicine form at least one Selection Committee for this degree programme.

(2) <sup>1</sup>A selection committee is comprised of three members eligible to vote, who belong to the scientific personnel working full-time or the professoral group, and a member of the student union with advisory vote. <sup>2</sup>At least one member must belong to the professoral group of the Faculty of Economic Sciences and one member to the professoral group of the Faculty of Medicine. <sup>3</sup>The members are appointed by the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Economic Sciences and the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Medicine. <sup>4</sup>The tenure of the members is two years, while that of the student group member is one year. <sup>5</sup>Reappointment is possible. <sup>6</sup>The selection committee has a quorum if at least two members eligible to vote are present.

- (3) The tasks of the selection committee are:
  - a) review of the incoming admissions applications for formal correctness,
  - b) review and assessment of the qualifications for entry, if necessary,
  - c) conducting the interviews in accordance with § 8,
  - d) decision on the admission or rejection of the applicant.

(4) The Selection Committee reports to the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Economic Sciences and the Faculty Council of the Faculty of Medicine about the experience gathered and submits any suggestions for further development of the award procedure, after conclusion of the award procedure.

#### § 5 Sequence of the selection procedure

(1) A selection procedure includes the award of university places based on the specific admission date.

(2) <sup>1</sup>A decision on the applications for admission is made in a main procedure and, if required, in the procedure for subsequent admissions. <sup>2</sup>In the first step of the main procedure, the university places will be awarded at first to the applicants entitled to admission with outstanding suitability (best quota; § 6) and then the applicants entitled to admission according to combination of several criteria (combination quota; § 7).

(3) <sup>1</sup> Any persons admitted based on best quota shall not be eligible to participate in the selection procedure based on combination quota. <sup>2</sup>Anyone who has been awarded admission

based on best quota or combination quota, shall not participate in any procedure for subsequent admissions.

(4) By overbooking, the selection committee can factor in university places that may not be taken up.

(5) Any university places still available after the best quota selection shall be included in the combination quota.

(6) <sup>1</sup>Moreover, the general provisions of the enrolment regulation of the University for enrolment remain unaffected. <sup>2</sup>The admission of the applicants fundamentally authorised for admission according to § 2 section 2, is subject to a condition subsequent until proof of the successful completion of the Bachelor's degree programme or an equivalent degree programme. <sup>3</sup>When enrolling for the winter semester, proof must be submitted by the end of 15 November. <sup>4</sup>If the Dean or the Dean of Studies confirms, on the basis of the periods of studies at present, in particular, the examination components at present, that the applicant will obtain the degree at the latest by the end of the first semester of the Master's course of study, the period according to sentence 3 will be extended upon enrolment for a winter semester until the end of 31 March; the confirmation is permitted only if

a) as examination results, only the thesis is missing or

b) the thesis has already been submitted to the university and the amount of the examination components that are still missing does not exceed six credits.

#### § 6 Best quota

(1) <sup>1</sup>For the selection as part of the best quota, a ranking list is generated in accordance with the provisions under section 2. <sup>2</sup>70% of university places shall be awarded according to this ranking, beginning with place 1. <sup>3</sup>In the event of identical ranking, ranking shall be determined according to the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. In all other cases, where there is identical ranking, lots shall be drawn to decide the outcome.

(2) For generation of the ranking list, a points scheme with which a maximum of 75 points are attainable is used.

a) according to the result of the bachelor's degree grade or the grade of an equivalent degree, points are awarded to the applicant as follows:

over 3.0 up to and including 3.1	19 points,
over 3.1 up to and including 3.2	17 points,

over 3.3 up to and including 3.4	13 points,
over 3.4 up to and including 3.5	11 points,
over 3.5 up to and including 3.6	9 points,
over 3.6 up to and including 3.7	7 points,

over 3.9 up to and including 4.0	1 point.

- b) For specialised knowledge in Statistics with a rating of at least 24 credits (ECTS), a maximum of 24 points are awarded in accordance with the following provisions. The components to be considered should be specified by the applicant:
  - ba) In case of credits in modules with high scientific level, the credits acquired through successful completion of these modules are multiplied by 1.0 points.
  - bb) In case of credits in modules with average scientific level, the credits acquired through successful completion of these modules are multiplied by 0.5 points.-
  - bc) The sums resulting from the respective multiplication are added.

bd) For credits in modules with a low academic level, no points are awarded.c) Points attained under a) and b) shall be added together.

(3) <sup>1</sup>Applicants, who can be admitted as part of the combination quota, receive a letter of admission from the university in text form. <sup>2</sup>This specifies the deadline by which the applicant must enrol or declare in text form whether he or she accepts the university place. <sup>3</sup>The applicant must enrol no later than two weeks after expiry of the deadline in accordance with sentence 2 (closing date), provided no enrolment in accordance with sentence 2 has been made. <sup>4</sup>If the University does not have

a) the enrolment under sentence 2 or

b) the declaration under sentence 2 and the enrolment under sentence 3

by the specified deadline and in the correct form, the letter of admission shall become invalid. <sup>5</sup>These legal consequences must be pointed out in the letter of admission.

(4) Students who have been admitted shall no longer take part in the further procedure.

#### § 7 Combination quota

(1) For the selection as part of the combination quota, a ranking list is generated in accordance with the following provisions. 30% of the university places are awarded according to the ranking list, beginning with place 1.

- (2) Selection is made based on a combination of the following criteria:
- a) Based on a ranking list, which is generated according to the procedure under § 6 section 2, and
- b) according to the result of an interview with the applicant.

(3) The selection committee screens the applications they have received according to section 4 and selects from the pre-selected applicants on the basis of the selection criteria mentioned in sections 2 and 5.

(4) <sup>1</sup>The received applications are screened to at least twice the number of university places to be awarded as per the selection procedure for limitation of the number of participants for the interview. <sup>2</sup>A ranking list is generated for this purpose in accordance with this procedure under § 6 section 2. <sup>3</sup>In the event of an identical ranking, all applicants in the highest ranking will be permitted to participate.

(5) <sup>1</sup>Selection shall be made on the basis of ranking, where a maximum of 85 points is attainable. <sup>2</sup>This is generated in accordance with the following provisions:

a) Points are awarded to the applicant as follows (maximum 10 points), depending on the assessment of the degree of suitability in the interview:

The applicant is	
very suitable	8 up to and including 10 points
suitable	4 up to and including 7 points
less suitable	1 up to and including 3 points
barely suitable	0 points.

b) Points are awarded to the applicant in accordance with the procedure under § 6 section2 (maximum 75 points).

c) Points attained under a) and b) shall be added together.

(6) <sup>1</sup>If there is identical ranking after generating the ranking list, the ranking sequence is determined based on the result of the points attained according to section 5 letter b), thereupon according to the result of the bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. <sup>2</sup>In all other cases, where there is identical ranking, lots shall be drawn to decide the outcome.

(7) The applicants selected shall be admitted in accordance with § 9.

#### § 8 Interview

(1) <sup>1</sup>The interview is intended to determine whether an applicant is suitable for the selected degree programme. <sup>2</sup>The following principles apply for carrying out the interview:

- a) the interview is normally held between 20 May and 20 June (applications for the winter semester) at the university. The exact dates as well as the place of interview are announced by the university within an appropriate period before the start of interviews. The university shall invite candidates to the interview with sufficient notice. A video conference or a telephone interview is permitted for overseas applicants as well as in justified exceptional cases, provided the identity of the applicant can be determined beyond doubt. The selection committee shall determine the details of the procedure in such cases.
- b) The selection committee shall carry out an interview lasting about 15 minutes with every applicant.

c) Minutes are kept of essential questions and answers within the interview; the said minutes must be signed by the members of the selection committee. The log should clearly show the day and place of the interview, the name of the committee members, the name of the applicant and the assessment.

(2) The interview extends to the motivation of the applicant as well as the following suitability parameters:

- a) capability for scientific and / or principle and method-oriented way of working,
- b) Previous experience and established knowledge of the scientific principles in the field of Statistics that were acquired as part of the degree programme upon which the application is based and are proven by documents,
- c) Clear-cut idea of the study contents of this degree programme,
- d) Professional and personal goals,
- e) extracurricular interests relevant to the degree programme.

(3) The members of the selection committee assess the applicant after conclusion of the interview to ascertain suitability for the selected degree programme on a scale according to § 7 section 5 sentence 2 letter a).

(4) <sup>1</sup>Any applicant who fails to attend the interview without good cause shall be excluded from the further procedure. <sup>2</sup>If there is a compelling reason, the selection committee will, upon application, set a new date for the interview. <sup>3</sup>Proof of the good cause should be provided and an application for rescheduling a new date should be made promptly to the selection committee, at the latest within two days after the date first scheduled. <sup>4</sup>An unsuccessful applicant is entitled to participate again in the next possible selection procedure.

#### § 9 Letter of admission, letter of rejection and procedure for subsequent admissions

(1) <sup>1</sup>Applicants, who can be admitted as part of the combination quota, receive a letter of admission from the university in text form. <sup>2</sup>This specifies the deadline by which the applicant must enrol or declare in text form whether he or she accepts the university place. <sup>3</sup>The applicant must enrol no later than two weeks after expiry of the deadline in accordance with sentence 2 (closing date), provided no enrolment in accordance with sentence 2 has been made. <sup>4</sup>If the University does not have

a) the enrolment under sentence 2 or

## b) the declaration under sentence 2 and the enrolment under sentence 3

by the specified deadline and in the correct form, the letter of admission shall become invalid. <sup>5</sup>These legal consequences must be pointed out in the letter of admission.

(2) <sup>1</sup>Applicants who cannot be admitted in the combination quota receive a rejection letter, in which the attained ranking and the ranking of the applicant last admitted are mentioned. <sup>2</sup>The letter of rejection shall provide information on rights of legal recourse. <sup>3</sup>In the case of applicants authorised for admission, it shall also contain a request that a declaration should be made in text form by a specified deadline as to whether the applicant does not submit this declaration by the deadline or in the correct form, they shall be excluded from the procedure for subsequent admissions. <sup>5</sup>Reference must be made to this legal consequence.

(3) <sup>1</sup>The procedure for subsequent admissions shall be carried out on the basis of the ranking in accordance with § 7 sections 5 and 6. <sup>2</sup>If the ranking list according to sentence 1 is exhausted, a ranking list is generated according to the provisions of § 6 section 2 and the procedure for subsequent admissions is carried out on the basis of this ranking list. <sup>3</sup>In the case of identical ranking after the generation of a ranking list, the ranking order is determined according to the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. <sup>4</sup>After which, in the event of identical ranking, the decision shall be made by drawing lots. <sup>5</sup>The provisions of section 1 apply correspondingly.

(4) <sup>1</sup>The selection procedures are completed at the latest on 15 November. for admission to a winter semester. <sup>2</sup>Any university places still available shall be awarded by lot to applicants authorised for admission, subject to informal application. <sup>3</sup>The application period for this begins two weeks before the start of the semester for which the admission should be made, and ends with the completion of the selection procedure. The provisions of the § 2 section 1 and 3 to 5 apply correspondingly. <sup>4</sup>The award of university places on the basis of a draw is completed at the latest on 30 November of a winter semester because of the advanced period of lecture in the case of admission.

## § 9a Hardship quota

(1) A special quota of 1.5 per cent of the number of admissions to this degree programme is formed in advance for cases of exceptional hardship (hardship quota), but at least in the amount of one study place.

(2) <sup>1</sup>The study places within the hardship quota are allocated on application to applicants who fulfil the admission requirements and for whom non-admission to this degree programme would mean exceptional hardship. <sup>2</sup>Exceptional hardship exists if special social or family

reasons in the applicant's person make immediate admission to the degree programme absolutely necessary. <sup>3</sup>Exceptional hardship includes in particular:

a) Caring for a child within the meaning of Section 25 (5) BAföG who has not yet reached the age of 14 at the start of the Master's degree programme,

b) Disability or serious illness,

c) care of a close relative in need of care according to an expert opinion of the medical service of the health insurance.

<sup>4</sup>The degree of exceptional hardship is assessed as follows:

The applicant has

-	more than one reason according to sentences 2 and 3 or a reason ir	n a particularly
	serious case	3 points
-	one reason according to sentences 2 and 3 in a serious case	2 points

- one reason according to sentences 2 and 3 1 point.

(3) <sup>1</sup>The ranking is determined by the degree of exceptional hardship, whereby only applicants who have achieved at least 1 point in accordance with section 2 sentence 4 will be considered. <sup>2</sup>If there is a tie after the ranking list has been drawn up, the ranking order shall be determined by the result of the assessment in accordance with Section 6 (2); if there is still a tie, the ranking order shall be determined by the result of the Bachelor's degree or an equivalent degree. <sup>3</sup>Otherwise, in the event of a tie, the decision shall be made by lot.

(4) <sup>1</sup>The decision is made by the selection committee. <sup>2</sup>The provisions of Section 9 (1) and (2) apply accordingly.

(5) Study places remaining available according to this quota shall be added to the quota for the selection procedure according to § 5.

## § 10 Admission to higher semesters

(1) Free university places in a higher semester with limited admission shall be awarded to applicants in the following sequence:

a) Those who are in the same or a similar degree programme,

aa) are or were enrolled at another German college or a college in another member state of the European Union or another signatory to the agreement on the European Economic Area.

ab) those who are or were enrolled at a foreign university and possess German nationality or are subject to the same university admissions laws and regulations as German citizens, b) those for whom rejection of admission would mean extraordinary hardship for personal reasons,

c) those who assert other reasons.

(2) Within each one of the three case groups in section 1, the result of the Bachelor's examination or an examination equivalent to the Bachelor's examination is decisive, followed by social, especially family-related, and economic reasons, and, finally, on the basis of a draw in cases that are still identical.

#### IV. Final provision

## § 11 Entry into force

This regulation enters into force on the day following its announcement in the official announcements I of University of Göttingen. It applies for the first time to the award procedure for the winter semester 2013/14.
